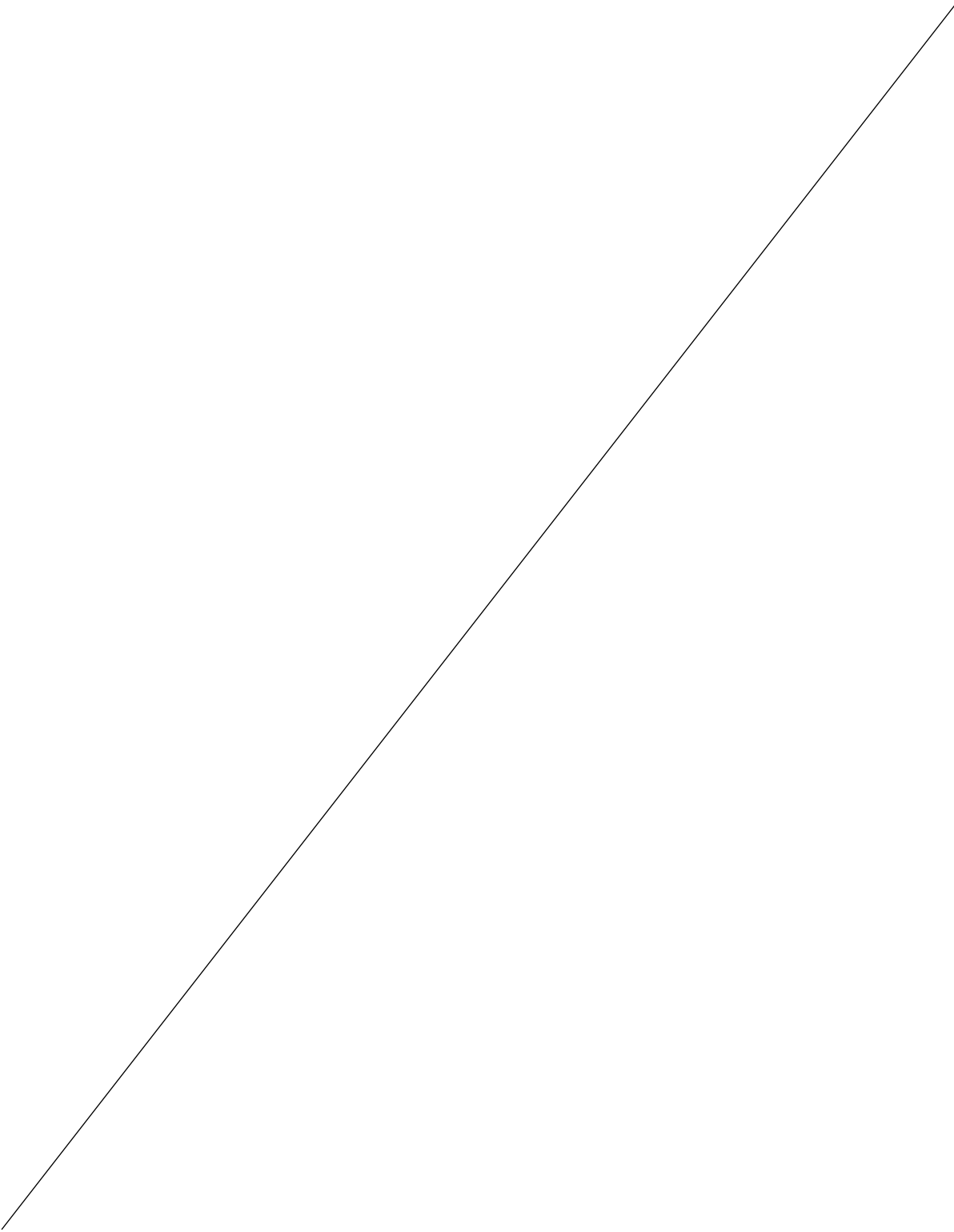

You are hereby warned that:

In light of an inspection conducted on the 26th of September 2024, the following concerns and contraventions were observed and must be rectified prior to the next slaughter:

1. Multiple sheep were placed together inside the stun-box, where multiple sheep were then stunned and then hoisted, resulting animals observing the death/slaughter process of another, as well as an exceedance of the stun-to-bleed time of 60 seconds.
 - a. Animals may not observe the death/slaughter process of another. Only 1 animal may be placed inside the stun box at a time, and only when the animal has been effectively stunned and hoisted away from the stun-box may another animal be presented.
 - b. The stun-to-bleed time may not exceed 60 seconds.
2. Animals kept on the left side of the lairages have a direct view at the beef stun-box and are likely to observe the stun/slaughter process. As discussed, a screen consisting of suitable material must be implemented to ensure no animal has a direct view of the beef stun-box.
3. The V & Amp's meter box did not indicate any readings during the stun of animals, and correct readings could not be taken to verify whether the stunner was malfunctioning, as multiple stuns appeared to be ineffective. A calibration test is required to ensure the current is accurate, and that the animals are stunned effectively with the utilised equipment.

You are reminded to at all times operated within the perimeters of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962, the Meat Safety Act 40 of 2000 with reference to the Red Meat Regulation No. 1072



This warning has been issued in terms of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act No 169 of 1993.

Failure to comply with this warning may render you liable for prosecution under the Animals Protection Act No 71 of 1962 and / or Performing Animals Protection Act No 24 of 1935.

Any person who:- obstructs, hinders or resists an officer authorised in terms of the Animals Protection Act No 71 of 1962 or conceals any animal shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 8(4) of the aforementioned Act.
