REPORT FOR SPCA DOG ORDER NUMBER N17/25 "SKY"

Sky was brought in to the clinic by Patrick Chiwawa and AWA from the Swartland SPCA, on 12/08/2025 and I was asked to complete a SAPS issue rape test kit.

Sky is a female brown and white sterilised pit bull terrier cross with a body weight of 17.6kg.

Sky was spayed at The Village Vet on 30/07/2025 as part of the Lotto Sterilisation project.

Clinical exam at time of presentation showed bleeding from vulva with some swelling of vulva. Body temperature 38.8, slightly pale mucous membranes, elevated heart rate. Abdominal palpation all normal. No obvious wounds. Submissive behaviour, walking in crouched position.

No obvious cause was found for the bleeding from the vulva. No sign of wounds to vulva or surrounding area but vulva tissue swollen. Digital exam of the vulva and vestibule was unremarkable except for blood. Two swabs were taken for the rape kit and I did an additionally swab from the cervical area. Examination of this sample under the microscope showed red and white blood cells, epithelial cells from the vagina and spermatozoa were present.

Origin of the spermatozoa is unknown.

Sky was given an anti-inflammatory injection and kept in hospital overnight to monitor bleeding and ensure that she is eating. Clinical examination this morning shows no further bleeding, swelling of vulva has reduced. Sky has eaten and drunk overnight and although still very submissive in her behaviour is no longer walking in a crouched position.
