General Report Comments: Upon arrival at the property I battled to gain access onto the premises. I was told that I need to provide details of the person that complained to us or else access was never going to be granted. I spoke to Mr Gule who informed me that he was the head of Security Management and those were security protocols of the hospital. I advised Mr Gule to speak to the hospital Management before deciding on the matter alone and I highlighted him of the legal implications that may arise as a result of his action. Eventually access was granted. I met with Mr Gule in his office. He mentioned that they did have an email and physical engagement with an external party who had advised about the removal of the birds to a farm but nothing was concluded because this person needed to have further engagements with the hospital CEO.

During my inspection I noted a number of feeding stations where only provision of water was available and shelter for the feral cats. I noted a large number of Peacocks and peahens as well as Guinea fowls that were roaming freely on the property. The hospital have some kind of vested interest on the birds because during my engagement with Mr Gule he did slightly highlight that the birds are part of the institution rehabilitation program for their patients and they were against total removal of all the birds. In such environment breeding is uncontrollable as they birds are living naturally.
