General Report Comments: Upon arriving at the complex, I tried getting a hold of the owner through the intercom several times, but I got no response. I spoke to the security on guard, Mr Moloi from Servest Security whom I've convinced to gain access to the unit. He escorted me to the unit where we met the gardener, Mr Khu Nxumalo and his colleagues, the helpers around the house. They told me to wait outside while they spoke to the owner of the house and dog because she was not feeling well. The helpers came back to allow me access to check the housing condition of the dog. I finally met the owner, Mrs Martine Wilkinson who owns a black, 6-year-old, neutered male Staffordshire terrier named "Flex" in a fairly acceptable condition. There was a pet-sitter from Ruby-Lee Manning Pet-sitting services watching over the dog during my inspection. The owner makes pet-setting services whether she is home or not. There were water bowls both indoors and outside. Flex had a bedroom provided for him. The dog, however, appeared to have a growth/lump on the left hind thigh which she said was a lipoma according to her vet, Dr Gary Eckersley that only monitoring as it is not a cancerous growth and will only grow back when drained or surgically get removed. Mrs Wilkinson said she takes the dog to Dr Eckersley twice a year to monitor the growth and get some samples. She also mentioned that the dog gets a Cytopoint injection every month to help with his allergies at the Parkmore Vet. "Flex" does bark throughout the day and he gave me the impression of being a very vocal dog sometimes especially when playing or wanting the gardener's attention. It was admitted to me that the dog barks at times. I requested proof of treatment of the dog from the so-called specialist vet.

Later that afternoon at approximately 16:18, Mrs Wilkinson sent me a Veterinary Report from Dr Gary Eckersley which stipulated the diagnosis of the lump. It stated that the lump is only monitored at least every 4 months. She said the Flex's next is in mid-November this year. To follow up at the end of November
