General Report Comments: Upon arrival at the communal yard, I went to the room that belonged to the dog owner, where I found the owner's girlfriend. She stated that he walked out, coming back shortly. He later joined us. He owns a dog that was found tied up to a toilet post on a static rope(using a fabric leash and collar) behind a public corrugated toilet with an overlapping room that provided some shade and a little hideout corner. A water container was provided for the dog, but the hideout was not serving as an adequate shelter from the elements. No fencing was erected next to his room, which is why he was keeping the dog on a static rope, according to him. I told him this was not acceptable due to the lack of freedom of movement, and the tying up of the dog could not afford the dog adequate space . He immediately made to one of his friends in Lombardy East, who agreed to hold onto Mr Manthata's dog while he was still planning on constructing a border fence for his dog. I issued a warning to him to rectify the situation within 5 days but he asured me to get sorted in a day.
