General Report Comments: A follow-up inspection was conducted at the above address to assess compliance with the previously issued warning (PHGF15144). While several items have been addressed, certain issues remain outstanding and require further action to achieve full compliance.

Findings:

1. White Duck:
The duck previously noted as unable to walk has reportedly received veterinary attention and been humanely euthenazed.
2. Owls in Clinic Area:
Some improvement was noted, with a few birds having been relocated or treated. However, not all owls had been examined by a veterinarian, and no comprehensive veterinary documentation was available for review.
3. Feeding Practices:
Food bowls have been introduced in several enclosures, but a few cages still had food scattered directly on the floors.
4. Water Provision:
Clean water was observed in most enclosures; however, a few holding cages still lacked readily available potable water.
5. Isolation of Injured Birds:
Some birds under treatment have been isolated, though a few enclosures still contain mixed populations, posing a risk of injury and stress.
6. Clinic Overcrowding:
The level of overcrowding has been reduced. Blankets are still being used as the birds slip on the newspaper
7. Spotted Eagle Owls:
A portion of the Spotted Eagle Owls have been separated into smaller groups , but isolation of those under treatment has not yet been fully implemented.
8. Veterinary Documentation:
Some veterinary reports have been obtained, but not all birds currently under treatment are accounted for. Complete records are still pending.
9. Aviary Cleanliness:
General cleanliness has improved; however, some aviaries still show faecal buildup and require more regular maintenance.
10. Shade Provision:
Shade has been added to certain aviaries, but full compliance for the Spotted Eagle Owl aviaries remains outstanding.
11. Perching Requirements:
Several aviaries have been fitted with new perches, but additional variation in perch sizes and placement is still needed.
12. Tortoise with Fractured Shell:
The tortoise has received attention; however, the veterinary report confirming the treatment and prognosis has not been submitted.

Conclusion:
Partial compliance with Warning PHGF15144 has been achieved. Notable progress has been made in improving feeding, hygiene, and isolation practices.
