General Report Comments: Upon arrival Field Officer Lenka Paulos Kholu and I were met by the Plant Manager Mr Monama . We were then introduced to QA Supervisor Mr Mahlangu and the Quality Control Team Leader Mr Mkhwanazi. Once introductions were made and PPE was issued, the inspection began. The inspection began in the clean area just after defeathering. The carcasses were inspected for any wing damage, bruising and other injuries indicative of inadequate handling. No carcasses were seen wit injuries or bruising. Before being able to proceed to the beginning of the production line, production was stopped as there was a chlorine gas leak. All chickens hanging from shackles were immediately taken down and returned to crates. During this time, I spoke with the meat inspector who gave me information with regards to the current batch of chickens. I was told that the current batch come from Freeka Boerdery, and according to the delivery note 10600 chickens were offloaded from the truck. The abattoir holds a capacity to slaughter 70 000 chickens per 9 hour shift; however, an average of 50 000 - 55 000 chickens are slaughtered per shift. No other trucks were expected for the remainder of the shift as the time of the production stop was uncertain. When discussing emergency protocols, there were none to show at the time. I advised that emergency protocols should be in place and that SPCA should be made aware of the contents as well as be included in the emergency contact list.

After about 45 minutes, the production could continue. Handling at the start of the production line where chickens were hoisted onto the
