

To Whom it may concern DBV, NSPCA, SPCA Springs.

This is a formal letter stating the **Plan of Care** in regard to all animals on the property of:

4 Harrison Selection Park, Springs.

Animals Are as follow:

1) 1 Male Dog: Shadow

Breed: Mixed, German Sheppard Mother, Pit-bull Father.

Color: Black and White.

Born 21st march 2023

None sterilized, None vaccinated, the Dog is dewormed every 6 Months, has a leash as well as a color and winter/summer jerseys that can be put upon him. The dog is given Bobtail Food with Bobtail gravy as well as Bob Martins vitamins. The Dog is bathed ones a month with a anti flea dip and dog shampoo. Shadow is a inside/outside dog he has a kennel outside with blankets under roofing as well as sleeps inside during bad weather and fireworks. Shadow gets played with by the owners children and can catch and fetch on command. Does not stay and sit as of jet. Shadow is not cat friendly towards outside cats but is fine with batman the male cat on the premises. To date there is no mention of a sibling but that might change at a future date. As of date it is not deemed necessary to obtain another dog. If at any date another dog is obtained both will be sterilized as I do not want to breed dogs at this stage.

2) 1 Male Cat: Batman

Breed: Unknown

Color: Black Cat

Born 9th August 2025

None Vaccinated, None Sterilized, The Cat is dewormed and 4 Months old at this time.

Bought at S.A. Venom bites Casseldale.

Batman will be a inside cat that uses a litter box inside for safety reasons. The cat will have adequate space in the house as well as toys to be bought for entertainment and mental stimulation. Plans are underway for fencing inside the windows that will also ensure that the cat will stay inside as well is kept safe from cars/cats/poison and people. The front patio will also be fenced in at a later date and time not specified at this stage due to other maintenance projects. The cat eats Catmore pallets and Tuna as well as milk as a treat. He will also be sterilized at a later time this year as I do not want him to breed. No future plans has been made to obtain another cat but if at a later stage another cat is obtained both will be fixed as I am not intending to breed cats at this stage.

3) 1 Bird: Liefeling

Sex: Unknown

Breed: Quaker Parrot

Color: Green.

Bought at S.A. Venom bites Casseldale.

The right side of the wing was broken before purchase rendering the parrot unable to fly.

The parrot was hand reared and is handled by Dr.Sheree Oliver. The parrot gets bathed as needed and eats parrot seed as well as vegetables steamed and fruit. As to date there is no plans for a mate or a companion due to the injury sustained before purchase the parrot will become a target amongst his peers and it was advised that the parrot not be placed near other parrots as this can cause emotional distress and/or physical harm.

4) 1 Male Monkey : Goku

Breed: Brown Tuffed, Capuchin Monkey .

Color: Golden brown with a black and white head.

Born: 24 October 2025

Bought at: Pettie Pretorius Capuchin Haven NPO (Reg No: 283- 234)

At time of Sale I Dr.Sheree Oliver was unaware that a NPO may not breed or sell their Animals as per Government Law.

Let it be known that the owners of said above animals are as follows:

Herewith commences the **Year Care Plan** as discussed verbally and written in a previous letter. On the day of the 30th in the month of December the year of 2025 a formal letter of warning was issued after an inspection under Warrant by the DBV SPCA Springs on the property of 4 Harrison Selection Park Springs. Where there was a formal complaint laid against Dr.Sheree Oliver and Mr. Henry Oliver in terms of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962, in respect of the keeping and treatment of a Capuchin Monkey (non-human primate) who at the time was known as Vickie a Female capuchin monkey. It was later found out on the 05/01/2026 that said Monkey was a Male thus the change in Name and Gender as stated above.

Let it be of note, that the following issues was found upon inspection and communication.

1. The Capuchin Monkeys ears had been pierced and earrings was placed in the ears. Although the earrings were removed prior to inspection, the piercing had already occurred. The owners of the monkey was informed that it is prohibited under the Animals Protection Act. Which at the time the owners was not informed and the earrings have since been removed and the piercings have closed with no infections and minimal scarring. No further physical alterations, cosmetic procedures ,or adornments will be made.

Let it be known that the Veterinary Doctor: Dr.W.Koen (BSc,BVSc.) specializing in wild life, located at Park Veterinary Hospital Boksburg (011)893 2117\8 has advised me that it is in the monkey Goku's best interest to remove the K9 teeth at 18months old and again main k9's at 3 years old. As well as it has been mentioned that when Goku starts to mature with his hormone changes aggression might become a problem and that by sterilization most of the anger and aggression will be prohibitive before social norm conformity dictates that he needs to rank in the social structure to mate. I told him I will take it under advisement and upon further studies and only if it is in Goku's best interest will there be a discussion of k9 removal and sterilization.

2. The property will be "monkey proofed" in terms that everything will get locks and or fencing to the property providing a safe and happy living space free of danger and stress. as well as an enclosure outside will be added

3. At the time of inspection, the capuchin monkey known as Goku did not have a secure, purpose built enclosure.

A patio has been identified as a future enclosure and a secure species- appropriate enclosure will be constructed. Dr.Sheree Oliver is researching the behavioral patterns, natural habitat, diet and psychological as well as physical needs of a capuchin monkey and will be incorporating adequate Height, Light, Mental and Physical opportunities as well as training enrichment of behavioral patterns and protection from the weather.

4. The Capuchin Monkey was being kept in nappies for extended periods of time.

There is an enclosure being built where the capuchin Monkey will be able to play in his enclosure without a nappy during the day as well as in the house without a nappies as he gets older. For the moment it is advised that Goko stays in loose fitted nappies as he is not yet fully mobile and has been seen sitting in his own fecal matter and trying to eat it. It is known that in the wild the baby sits on the mother and the mother is in a tree several feet up in the air, thus when fecal matter is released from the body it drops to the ground below where it cannot be consumed by the baby monkey. In this matter with cleanliness, hygienic practices, and consistency in behavioral patterns the baby monkey should not feel psychological distress, irritation of skin has been noted around upper back area and medication has been prescribed. Further consideration is needed upon the use of a nappy indoors and while traveling, as scientific studies in the past have been immoral and lacking in information on the well being of said Animal.

5. Goku was seen by a general vet who did not have the needed specialized training to properly care for a (non-human primate.)

Goku is no longer seen by a general vet. He is now under the care of Park Vet Hospital where there is a wildlife specialist on staff and Dr.Koen comes highly recommended by multiple (non-human primate)owners. He will be treating Goku with all needed vaccinations and parasitic controls as needed and deemed needed by the Veterinary Hospital.

6. Let there be a known record that Goku has been given a clean health certificate stating that there is no physical signs of bacterial/fungal or parasitic infections upon him nor is there any evidence of malnourishment at this time. Note that there was no marks of abuse both physically and mentally there is no signs of injustice except for that pointed out and corrected, mentioned above. A copy of the Certificate will be attached.

7. Socializations

It has been brought to my attention that socialization of a capuchin monkeys is extremely important and that without socialization Goku might become aggressive and anti social which may lead to self harm, injury, stress as well as behavioral deterioration. To remedy this I have arranged social interaction with 2 other owners of {non-human primates} on a once a month meeting and socialization as well as looking into the option of obtaining another {non-human primate} preferably a female companion. If a female companion is obtained both male and female will be sterilized as I do not wish to breed and sell Non-human Primates.

8. Transport

Wildlife are particularly susceptible to transport stress and all reasonable steps shall be taken to minimize that stress. The general principles for transport detailed in particular reference shall be made to the wildlife section of the IATA regulations, to The Capture and Care Manual, and to SANS 10331. 8.3.6.2 Stress during transport can be minimized by:

- a) ensuring the appropriate size, design and construction of transport containers;
- b) limiting animals from exposure to temperature extremes, noise, visual disturbance and vibration;
- c) providing, if appropriate for the species, an inner shelter within the transport container;
- d) ensuring that animals are separated where there is incompatibility of species, age, size, sex or reproductive status;
- e) preventing unnecessary handling; and
- f) administering sedatives and tranquillizers, if appropriate, by suitably trained persons.
