Special conditions in terms of Act 24/35 Sec 7 (d), Read with Amendment Act 4 of 2016 Sec 3C (1) (h):

1. Proof of a valid PAPA licence must accompany the animals at all times, in line with Regulation 7 of the PAPA.
2. On request, the PAPA licence must be presented to a police officer, including an animal welfare inspector authorised as a police officer in terms of Section 8 of the Animal Protection Act, (Act 71 of 1962).
3. A police officer must be allowed access, in terms of Act 4 of 2016, Section 4, at any reasonable time to a premise, place or vehicle whereby performing animals may be used.
4. When animals under this licence are moved to a facility not listed on this licence, the licencing officer has to be notified 7 days before the intended movement, in line with Regulation 6. This will also be applicable to movements of new animals to this facility. This will be applicable to movements of new animals to this facility or movement of animals to new secondary facilities and/or rental clients, as well as movement to temporary facilities, where the dogs will stay for a period of less than 5 days.
5. Any restraining methods used on the animal shall not cause pain, distress, injury or suffering and should be supplemented with species appropriate measures to reduce stress.
6. It remains the responsibility of the licence holder to feed, care for and house all the above mentioned animals and maintain the facilities, transport and other equipment to meet all the animal welfare needs.
7. The officer has to be informed if there is any change to the number or type of species used.
8. It remains the responsibility of the licence holder to ensure that he/she submits the correct PAPA application form, correctly completed, at least 2 months before a valid PAPA licence expires, to papa@dalrrd.gov.za and Cc Dr Pepler here in the province Ansulize.Pepler@westerncape.gov.za and papa.els@westerncape.gov.za. 9. It remains the responsibility of the licence holder to ensure that the facility veterinarian will visit the facility at least twice per year at an interval of at least 4 months apart.
10. In accordance with Section 2 (1) (b) of the Animal Protection Act, (Act 71 of 1962) no animal may be confined, chained, tethered or secured or kept under such conditions or in such a manner or position as to cause that animal any suffering or in any place which affords inadequate space, ventilation, light, protection or shelter from heat, cold or weather.
11. All animals should be appropriately and safely transported at all times. Any incidences during loading and transport should be reported to the LO.
12. Only fit, healthy and appropriately trained dogs may be used for safeguarding.
13. Dogs and dog handlers must be trained to an equivalent level by a SASSETA accredited/PSIRA registered training facility and the dog handler must be registered with PSIRA in this capacity.
14. Safeguarding dogs may only work with a PSIRA registered dog handler (DH) trained to the same level as the dog, for example DH2-patrolling and deter crime, DH4-searching and apprehension off-leash or DH5-detection.
15. Assessment of dogs and dog handlers to confirm/maintain their grading and update their certification should be conducted annually
16. For short resting periods during a working shift, the dog must be secured in an appropriate sized duty enclosure with an appropriate sized kennel and fresh water. The dog may not be left unattended at a facility during or between working shifts.
17. Dogs must return to an off-site off-duty enclosure (primary facility) between working shifts and off days where appropriate care and exercise routines are maintained.
18. If off-duty enclosures are not located off-site (animals are permanently on site) the enclosures must be built, equipped and the animals managed during the off-duty period at the same standard as at a primary facility. A registered DH1 (minimum requirement) dog handler and/or inspector must check on the dogs off-duty and take them to a safe exercise camp/area/activity where the dog has the opportunity for natural behaviour, including elimination behaviour (urination and defaecation) and possibly playing activities/exercise, at least once in a 12 hour off-duty period. During this time the enclosure should be cleaned.
19. For short resting periods during a working shift, the dog must safely be removed from the tactical vehicle, to allow for urination/defaecation, movement/exercise and have fresh water. The dog may not be left unattended in a vehicle during or between working shifts.
20. Minimum operating, equipment and facility (tactical vehicle) standards should be maintained in order to ensure the welfare of the animals, for example fresh air and a comfortable ambient temperature is required.

21. Should dogs be utilised at facilities that are not listed on the current licence for a period longer than five days, the licence holder must supply (email) the relevant site details (client, address, contract period) as well as any additional number of animals used, site plan, amendments to SOP's, list of additional DHs that will be deployed at the new site(s) etc. to the licencing officer, requesting an amendment of the licence, within 7 days after the dogs' arrival at the new facility. 22. Dogs used for safeguarding must be confined in an appropriately size enclosure with an appropriately sized kennel or in a secure play (exercise) pen to accommodate the dog safely when not under the direct control of the dog handler.
23. This licence is issued subject to the registration of Dog Handlers (DH) with PSIRA, as listed as a non-conformance on the corrective action report. Registration is only valid upon submission of DH training by a PSIRA/SASSETA registered training facility.
24. Dogs used for safeguarding may only be rented to PAPA-licensed, PSIRA registered security service providers. These rental clients are listed in the licence/ monthly addendum under "other PAPA licensed facilities to whom dogs are rented"
25. The licence validity is subject to forwarding an updated list of all rental clients and secondary facilities to the LO and Cc Ansulize.Pepler@westerncape.gov.za and papa.els@westerncape.gov.za on a monthly basis. The list must be forwarded by the 7th of each month. The licence addendum will accordingly be amended and must accompany the licence to confirm the validity of the licence (for that month).
26. The safeguarding dog rental contract has to specify the responsibility of either the dog rental facility or the renting security provider to provide appropriately trained and registered dog handlers for each rental dog used for safeguarding. This licence is issued subject to the amendment of all contracts dates
27. Minimum operating, equipment and facility standards should be supplied by the security dog rental facility to all clients using their dogs in order to ensure the welfare of the animals is not compromised at any stage
