Report/Findings: We observed 24 cattle including 17 cows have a skin disease. The farm manager Mr. Heymans told us that the cows suffer from a disease which is known as hair mites caused by mites. He also informed us that the enclosure where the cows are kept is very moist and wet which causes the infestation of mites and that the specific areas are not adequate for the cattle.

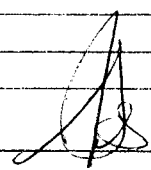

Background

The Mosselbay branch received a call regarding cattle which were in a poor condition. The call was given through to trainee inspector Luciano who attended to the call. According to Luciano he could not gain access to the property; but were able to see the cows from a distance. I advise them to get clearer footage to assess the seriousness of the the situation; which they did. Some of the cattle appears to be underweight and were full of ticks.
