Comments by Inspector:

The staff used the prodders in accordance with the SANS codes except for one incident where the one staff member prodded on a sensitive area. This was addressed and they stopped using the prodders after that. The handling of the animals went better than it did last week, however, it was evident that by the end of the day the staff got fed up and impatient at times. We reminded them to consider their handling and it got better again.

There were six compromised animals seen during the inspection. Two cattle had blindness in one of their eyes. This had been addressed with the buyer of the animal and a warning issued to procure veterinary treatment. Two other cattle appeared to be sick (diarrhea and nasal discharge), these animals were allegedly for immediate slaughter. One sheep was observed to have a skin condition on his face, he was sold for immediate slaughter. One sheep presented with severe lameness. He didn't put any pressure on
