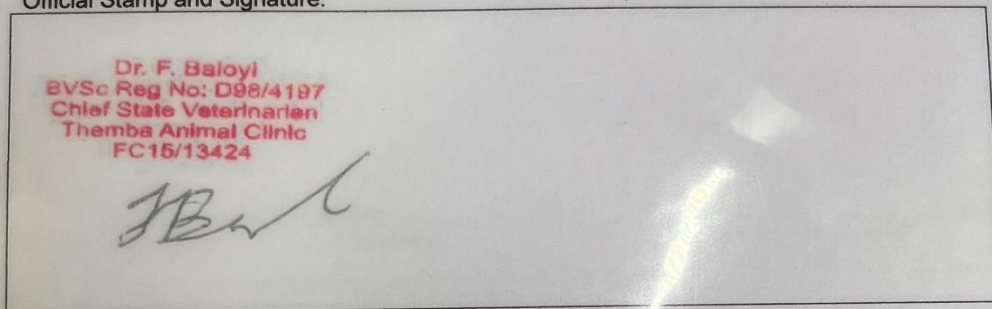

Please note:

The licence can be issued subject to special conditions. These can include but are not limited to the following.

Conditions:

- The public should not be encouraged to keep wild animals or birds in captivity
- Touching, petting or stroking of wild animals or birds by the public should be controlled
- Animals used for human interaction must be allowed to retreat and allowed rest periods without human interference or interaction.
- Any restraining methods used on the animals or birds shall not cause pain, injury or suffering
- The officer is to be informed if there is any change to the number or type of species.
- A monitor/Animal Welfare inspector must be present during the use of animals in the filming industry, apart from appropriate PAPA licenced animal trainers. This will be indicated by a report from the AW Inspector.
