EQUIPMENT

Recommend the use of half-check or mesh control/slip collars, instead of the full metal version. The metal chains have a high potential of damaging a dog if not used correctly. Whether metal or mesh, it is essential that the collars are well maintained and "slip" properly so as not to choke or damage the dog.

What equipment is used? Collars or harnesses.
