EXAMINATION FINDINGS

On 7/9/23 the animal of concern was presented for Veterinary health checks in our hospital. On clinical examination it was found that the animal has multiple, of which one was very large, +-8 x 10cm, cancerous masses on the mammary glands. The biggest one was on the caudal glands, on both sides. The general condition of the animal was fair with a fair quality hair coat. There were no severe signs of any neglect, but the animal could have gotten medical attention earlier in which these masses could've been removed, and the condition could have been prevented.

- **Description:** Cancer mass on mammary glands
- **Prognosis** – Poor
- **Recommendation:** Animal was humanely euthanized

COMMENTS

Cancer mass of this size and on this location almost always ends up to be very extensive, which leads to the animal being euthanized, hence the reason given above that this could have been prevented if the owners went for medical intervention at a Veterinary professional at an earlier stage.

Due to the extent of the mass involved and the suffering it already is causing and can potentially cause in the future, it was decided that the best for this animal is to be euthanized.
