ANIMALS CURRENTLY UNDER VETERINARY TREATMENT

We require written confirmation that the below listed animals are in fact under veterinary treatment and receiving veterinary attention. Please forward such written confirmation to insp8@spca-ct.co.za by no later than close of business on Tuesday, 26 September 2023.

1. The Rhesus Monkey on heart medication which causes water retention making her appear overweight.
2. The various monkeys (one Black-Capped Capuchin and various Squirrel monkeys) with hair loss on their tails.
3. The Rock Hyrax which appears to have excessive nasal discharge.
4. The Marabou Storks with healed broken wings.
5. The Cape Vultures with healed broken wings.
6. The Jackal Buzzard with a healed broken wing.
7. The Dwarf Goat with dysplasia and that is on MobiFlex.
8. The Leopard Tortoise appearing to have a condition affecting its eye.
9. The Blue Tongued Skink with old burn wounds and which appeared to experience difficulty in shedding which you informed us was 23 years or older.

BIRDS WITH FEATHER LOSS AND PERFORMING FEATHER PLUCKING

During our inspection you informed us that you are actively working with Cape Exotic Vets to take a holistic approach in addressing birds performing feather plucking by addressing the veterinary/medical aspect, the nutritional aspect, as well as the behavioural aspect. We require written confirmation that the below-listed birds are being included in your treatment plan as well as confirmation of what the treatment plan is. Such confirmation must be forward to insp8@spca-ct.co.za by no later than close of business on Tuesday, 26 September 2023.

10. The Citron Cockatoo with feather loss on its chest.



11. The Illiger's Macaw missing its tail feathers.
12. The two (2) African Greys with feather loss on their chests.
13. The Eclectus Parrot with feather loss on its neck and chest.
14. The Galah Cockatoo with feather loss on its chest.
15. The Bare-Eyed Cockatoo with feather loss on its neck, chest, and abdomen.
16. The Goffin's Cockatoo with feather loss on its chest.

HAZARDOUS OBJECTS INSIDE ENCLOSURES

During our inspection, we observed various enclosures to have protruding nails or wires inside.

17. We require written confirmation that hazardous objects such as protruding wires and nails will be removed from enclosures more frequently and routinely (thereby maintaining enclosures in a state of good repair to prevent injury to animals housed inside the enclosures). Such confirmation must be forwarded to insp8@spca-ct.co.za by no later than Tuesday, 26 September 2023.

ADEQUATE AND SUFFICIENT PROTECTION FROM WEATHER AND TEMPERATURE EXTREMES

We require proof that the below-listed animals have been provided with additional adequate and sufficient protection from weather and temperature extremes by no later than Tuesday, 26 September 2023. Such proof must be forwarded either to 064 363 4455 or to insp8@spca-ct.co.za.

18. The Blue Fronted Amazon Parrot who doesn't have provision of adequate protection from weather and temperature extremes inside its enclosure.
19. The two (2) African Grey Parrots who don't have provision of adequate protection from weather and temperature extremes inside their enclosure.
20. The Flamingos who don't have provision of sufficient protection from weather and temperature extremes inside their enclosure.

PROVISION OF SUITABLE AND APPROPRIATE LIVING CONDITIONS INCLUDING PERCHING

Some of the birds in your care require provision of additional perching varying in diameter size, especially to the Bare-Eyed Cockatoos housed between the Blue Fronted Amazon and the Galah Cockatoos.



21. Proof that the above-mentioned Bare-Eyed Cockatoos have been provided with additional perching must be sent to 064 363 4455 or insp8@spca-ct.co.za by no later than Tuesday, 26 September 2023.
22. Written confirmation that enclosures in general at the park are being improved and enlarged (as per the discussion during our inspection) including that such improvements will include adequate and sufficient perching and flight opportunities for birds as well as the opportunity for birds to express other natural behaviours must be sent to insp8@spca-ct.co.za by no later than Tuesday, 26 September 2023.
