Toska (INSP174665) - 1256 Abdurrahman Street, Bellville South

I first reported Toska's neglect on 28 October 2022; over 6 months down the line she is still being put in situations where she has no water and is taken off of her runner and chained to something else .

Please advise as to when her neglect ends; how many warnings and visit do you need to have? Is it when she collapses from dehydration? Bites someone out of frustration? I cannot help but be frustrated as your inspectors have witnessed her neglect and are sent back over and over again, only for the neglect to start up again once your visits stop. We have asked before but will ask again; are there different rules for different dogs who are visited by different inspectors? It certainly seems that way as one moment removing a runner for the 100th time equals a final warning but for another dog the process just starts again or a car port is adequate shelter INSP 167711 with only a roof and the dog curled up in a ball with no blankets but then the next case INSP 183870 has a car port with a roof and doors to stop the wind plus dog has a blanket but that is inadequate so the owner is told to get a kennel?? It just does not make sense.
