The last time I heard feedback about these dogs I was told that someone is living under the stairs where they usually sleep as they lost their house and I sympathise for this person but we are currently experiencing one of the coldest winters in many many years and these dogs STILL have NOWHERE to sleep so I'm going to need someone to spell the reasoning for this ongoing neglect that you are allowing out for me. I would also just like to remind you that I first reported this neglect almost a year ago so one can imagine how many wet, cold nights these 6 dogs have had!

I saw them in the pouring rain on Friday night and proceeded to towel dry them and then take them around to the back to feed them under the stairs where it's slightly drier but when I got there I found that there was a ton of rubbish taking up the ONE SPACE that they have to seek warmth so I started moving things around so as to make space for them and was horrified to find a man still living there; I apologised profusely as I would never intentionally disrespect where someone is living but also explained that the dogs have nowhere dry to sleep.

With all this said, I would like to repeat myself in asking that someone explain to me why almost 365 days later, these dogs are still without shelter?? I genuinely need and want to understand the reasoning behind your decision to keep allowing these owners to get away with murder while their 6 dogs feel the icy rains down to their bones.
