To whom it may concern

On the 4th of October 2024, I was presented with Peanut by SPCA inspector Jeffrey. Peanut was surrendered by Shirley Bothman from 55 2nd Avenue Belmont park.

EXAMINATION FINDINGS

- **Description** of the condition:
Friendly nature, good body condition
Peanut has bilateral moderately enlarged submandibular lymph nodes
Small fleshy mass 1.2cm x 1cm on ventral margin of anus, bleeding when touched
Rectal examination: firm faeces felt in rectum
Mucous membranes: pink moist
Adequate hydration
No other visible wounds or masses noted
- **Duration** of the condition: unknown
- **Prognosis** – poor to good
- **Recommendation** –

I recommend that the mass seen on the anus is removed and sent for a biopsy to a Veterinary Pathologist who can exam the mass and determine cause. We have started him on anti-inflammatories and antibiotics to see if swollen lymph nodes subsides, if not, further diagnostic tests are warranted.

COMMENTS

As faeces passes through the anus it can cause the mass to bleed or to become infected. Mass can be traumatised when Peanut sits down causing it to bleed more, it is advisable it is removed. Owner has surrender Peanut to the SPCA.
