Upon arrival I met a young girl who told me they have cats, but that her sister is not home. She then mentioned that there are pep Living at the back of the property who has cats and a dog. I then told her to call the which she did. I then met The owner of the dog in question and shared the reason for my visit to the property, mentioning that die to the other cats owner not being home that I would follow-up with them aswell.

During the time he came to me the dog was free roaming, but when I cmwas calling I didn't seenor hear the dog. He then told me before he will let me onto the property that he is going to tie the dognup as she is aggressive, which he did. He then came back to fetch me. As we were walking to the back of the property I observed his cats who appears to be in fair condition and alert with body scores of 2.5-3/5.

I then observed the dog in question who was tied up to a very short chain. While tied up she could not access her water or kennel as the chain was very short. Her living area appears to be well maintained. The dog in question appears to have a skin condition, which the owner claims he has been treating with coconut oil. I then told him that, that oil is not good enough and that he would have to take the dog to the vet. I also told him about the running chain method and showed him what kind of material he can use for the dog which would not be costly to him as he told me any changes that would need to be made will cost money which he does not have.

As I was still talking to him he went inside his Wendy and started doing his own thing talking to someone inside the wendy I could not see. He told me that he would rather surrender the dog and his cat as he does not have money. I then wanted him to sign the dogs over , but he refused to give any of his details or sign the paperwork and as he was raising his voice the dog also became more agitated.

I then issued a NTC for him as he now has completely refused to talk listen to me.

Provide your dog who's name you refused to give with adequate veterinary treatment as she appears to have a skin condition.

- 2) Place your dog on a running chain as shown on property as the short chain she is tied up to is obstructing her from expressing natural behaviour.
- 3) Should you not be able to provide above mentioned you have the option to surrender the animal/s to the Cape of Good Hope SPCA.

- 4) You have 96hours to do so.
