You are hereby warned that:

1. No person shall exhibit or permit to be exhibited any animal of which he is the owner or has the lawful custody, unless such person is the holder of a valid licence in terms of the Performing Animals Protection Act 24 of 1935, as amended in 2016.

Please refer to Section 1 of the Performing Animals Protection Act 24 of 1935:

1. Restriction on exhibition and training of performing animals and use of animals for safeguarding.—No person shall exhibit or train or cause or permit to be exhibited or trained for exhibition any animal of which he is the owner or has the lawful custody or use any animal for safeguarding unless such person is the holder of a licence.
[S. 1 substituted by s. 1 of Act No. 7 of 1991.]

- a. Should you not be in possession of a valid Performing Animals Protection Act Licence then you are not permitted to exhibit any animal and must forthwith cease to exhibit any such animal to avoid further action and/or criminal prosecution.
 - b. Kindly forward a copy of your valid Performing Animals Protection Act Licence **within 48 hours** to our office by email to inspmanager@spca-ct.co.za
2. Parasitic conditions
 - a. The enclosures were extremely dirty, and the inspector also observed a built-up of excessive dog hair in the enclosure, including underneath the kennels. This creates dirty conditions. You need to ensure that you maintain and hygienically clean the dogs' enclosures and remove any other rubble and cleaning products from the enclosures within **7 days**.

We remind you to adhere to all the provisions of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962, Performing Animals Protection Act 24 of 1935 (as amended in 2016) & its supporting Regulations and the City of Cape Town Animal Keeping By-Law at all times.

This warning has been issued in terms of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 169 of 1993.

Failure to comply with this warning may render you liable for prosecution under the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962 and/or Performing Animals Protection Act 24 of 1935.

Any person who:- obstructs, hinders or resists an officer authorised in terms of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962 or conceals any animal shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 8(4) of the aforementioned Act.
