Comments by Inspector:

Frans, one of the handlers, had to be repeatedly reminded to not pick up the sheep by their wool.

Bongi was shouted at and scolded by the owner who told us that it is his farm, and his animals and we cannot tell him how to run his farm.

The area/pens where clean and free of obstructions. Each pen had sufficient water for the sheep. We did not see any injured or distressed animals. There are no loading ramps and this meant that the animals had to be lifted into the trailers.

When we arrived, they were loading the one bakkie, the owner of the farm was told by the buyer/owner of the bakkie, that the farm worker cannot load animals like that, and reminded the farm owner that the SPCA is watching and the farm owner swore and said it's his farm he will load and do as he wants to.
