1. Type of transport used Inappropriate-owners came with sheep tethered in the back of their car.
2. Are vehicles suitable No - car boxes or bakkies without ventilation or nonslip flooring.
3. Average distance travelled Owners told us they didn't come from far but we told them it still is not acceptable.
4. Number of vehicles inspected At least 10 vehicles. Detail problems 5 of the vehicles were inappropriate.

Warnings: 13602, 13603, 13604, 13605, 13607 - transport unsuitable.

Facilities and Handling YES-INSPECTED

5. Are animals off-loaded humanely Yes-only because Stephen ^{told?} showed them how to beforehand.
6. Are suitable ramps provided Not applicable- no ramps, Stephen instructed humane offloading.
7. Are animals handled and moved humanely Yes but only because Stephen ensured such.
8. Are holding pens provided or are animals tied up Holding pens
9. Are pens overcrowded No - adequate space and animal ratio
10. Is food provided Yes Type Grain mixture (mash)
11. Is water provided Yes
12. Are there downers, sick or injured animals Yes - 2 sheep with nasal discharge & 1 sheep with lameness & small mouth injury.
 Are they slaughtered No - one of the four were not slaughtered and they took long.
13. Do holding pens overlook slaughter areas No
14. Is shade provided Yes

Comments They didn't slaughter for us immediately and Stephen and I had to issue

Warning 18302. They were eventually slaughtered except for one - they said they couldn't reach the owner.

Slaughter - Small Stock (Goats and Sheep)

15. Are animals handled humanely (no dragging / kicking etc) No Stephen and I had to rectify handling by the legs many times - they were already taught to pick up using at least 2 people yet this concern was constantly having to be addressed.

16. Type of animals being used Thick-fleeced sheep
17. Is animal held properly for slaughter Yes - they are restrained in an acceptable manner.
(not knelt on etc)
18. Is bleeder ready to slaughter Yes, as much as possible as they do 3 animals at a time.
19. Is knife sharp and adequate size Yes
20. Is knife sharpened regularly No - they (Riaz) should sharpen more regularly but knife was sharp during inspections.
21. Is slaughterer competent Yes but only Riaz, not owners. Stephen had to stop I ran from seeing at the neck.
22. If more than 2 strokes – why 1 - incompetent slaughterer, Stephen made Riaz stop in.
23. Does dressing of the carcass take place once bleeding is complete and there are no signs of life Yes - they wait and clean as much as possible while waiting and before the carcass is taking. They also check corneal reflexes.
24. The sides of bleeding pit where cut takes place – is it cleaned, hosed or blood covered with sand (no pools of blood) between cuts Yes - but Stephen and I had to remind them to do so.

Large Animals (Cattle) They do not slaughter large stock.

Comments Stephen and I found a dog confined to an extremely unhygienic cage without any water. This dog was provided with water and soon after removed from the cage. Although issues addressed were rectified, another warning must be issued.

Approximately **100 Sheep, 15 Goats** and **0 Cattle** inspected

Confinement of animals:

Caged - adequate space. Animals are being held in pens for Qurbani.

There was also a dog confined to a cage.

They told us the dog mostly free roams on the property and that they used to put him on a running chain during Qurbani but now they placed him in the cage for Qurbani due to the amount of people entering the farm. This however, couldn't be true based on the accumulated faeces found in the cage.

Adequate space available:

Yes

Clean living environment:

No - the dog's cage contained old, rotting cardboard and accumulated faeces. The pens confining the small livestock for Qurbani were hygienic.

Water available:

No - the dog was found confined without any water. The animals for Qurbani all had access to water.

Adequate shelter available:

Yes

Animals in good condition:

Yes

Veterinary problems / Health concerns:

Yes - 2 sheep with nasal discharge, 1 sheep with lameness, and 1 sheep with a small injury on the corner of its mouth. The 2 with nasal discharge and the 1 with lameness was slaughtered but the sheep with the small mouth injury wasn't slaughtered and they said they can't slaughter that one because it had already been sold and they need to arrange with the owner. Stephen and I explained that they have to slaughter or provide veterinary or medical attention to the sheep within an hour. When we kept coming back, the sheep was still not sorted and so we issued a Warning for the sheep to get adequate treatment within 12 hours (seeing as the small mouth wound was not severe and the sheep could still eat).

General comments:

Stephen and I found the dog in the cage on Sunday, 16 June 2024. The cage affords adequate space and ventilation but is extremely unhygienic with accumulated faecal matter and old, rotting cardboard. They told us the dog is usually free roaming on the property (and that they previously used to have him on a running chain) and that they only placed him in the cage now for Qurbani and due to the amount of people entering the property, however, the faecal matter and state of the cage states otherwise.

Transport of animals was found to be inappropriate. Clients of Johnson Farm came with sheep tethered in the boot of their car or with sheep in the back of closed bakkies without adequate ventilation.

When asked where they came from, Johnson Farm's clients said they came from "not far" and "from around the corner".

One of the sale yards they came from (which we were able to get directions for) was later inspected: 'D & M Livestock' situated at 747 Boom Road, Schaapkraal, Philippi.

It was explained to them that even if they came from around the corner, they are not permitted to transport any animals in such a manner.

Warnings issued:

Each client was issued with a warning for the inappropriate transport of animals:

- **Warning 13602** issued to AA Liembeso.

- **Warning 13603** issued to Abdul Samed.
- **Warning 13604** issued to MM Hussein.
- **Warning 13607** issued to Ali Abd.

Other concerns found at Johnson's Farm included us having to point the compromised animals out to them and asking them to slaughter such animals.

A warning, **Warning 18302**, was issued to Nabelah Johnson (Asa Johnson's daughter) for them to provide sick or injured animals in their care with adequate veterinary treatment within 12 hours.

It was explained that sick or injured animals must receive medical treatment or attention immediately and as soon as possible and that such animals must be isolated for treatment.

The warning confirms that Johnson farm was notified of a sheep with an injury on its mouth earlier that day and although they slaughtered the other compromised animals pointed out to them, they had not sorted this sheep out due to being unable to get a hold of the owner. It was stated that the sheep needs to receive medical treatment either way.

An ointment was placed on the mouth of the sheep by Riaz, Nabelah's husband, and it was confirmed that the sheep would be slaughtered as soon as they had spoken to its owner.

The warning issued to Nabelah was supposed to include that they must not confine their dog in unhygienic conditions and without water but I forgot to include this in the warning as that morning when it was addressed with them, they immediately rectified the concerns.

Tomorrow an additional warning will be issued for the conditions the dog was found in today. Lastly, once Qurbani has ended, a follow up inspection must be conducted on the dog and its alleged running chain.
