Re: Three calves that were injured in a motor vehicle accident.

1] 8 months old Friesland heifer: The heifer has a laceration of the skin of about 10 cm on the left shoulder blade. No muscle or bone is involved.

The heifer is not lame.

The wound is too old to suture, and the heifer was treated by Mr Braaf with antibiotics and a wound spray, and he will continue to do so.

2] 6 months old beef bullock: The bullock is lame in the right hind leg.

With my examination I found that he had an injury of the hip joint.

No sign of a fracture could be located, and the hip did not feel dislocated.

He was able to walk and run, and did put weight on the leg.

3] 3 months old beef heifer: She is also lame in the right hind leg.

With my examination I found she had an injury of the hip joint and the knee.

No sign of a fracture could be located.

The hip joint and knee did not feel dislocated.

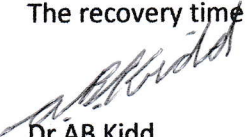
She is also able to walk, and did put a little bit of weight on the leg.

The prognosis of both the last two animals is fair to good, because they are young, and not too heavy.

They are both able to get up when lying down.

The most important treatment apart from an analgesic, is that they must be kept in a small paddock to restrict their movement.

The recovery time will be six to eight weeks, or more.
