Comments by Inspector:

I carried out the inspection at this sale yard. I announced my arrival at the office and was allowed to carry out my inspection. Two cattle was seen down in the races. I asked the owner of the cattle and he advised that they had been lying down for about 30min prior to my arrival. I tried to check for any obvious injury but couldn't find any. He says that the cattle are stressed as they have never been transported and this is their first time in a trailer. The cattle also appeared slightly underweight. After about 30min, one of the cows got up and went to the kraals. The other one still didn't get up. After waiting another hour, I informed them that if they second cow doesn't get up, they would have to either get a veterinarian out or I'm going to have to euthanize her. They waited another 45min and decided to load the their other cattle again. When the cattle came back, the second cow got up and went into the truck. When the cow walked, no obvious injuries were seen. I told them that this cow would need to be isolated uring transportation which they did. Both cows were also about 7months pregnant. I issued them with a warning informing them that they are not allowed to transport heavily pregnant animals. The first cow that initially got up lied down inside the kraal and refused to get up from there. After trying about 15min to get her up, the owner decided to rather let her rest for the night. He said he would provide food and water and ask the staff that stays on the property to keep an eye on the cow. After ...
