Hi Carina

Its me again regarding the dogs at JRE Transport. We need to get this sorted out. On two occasions, they have almost attacked two of our staff members that were walking up to the company. Both times, I have been standing by car - they are starving on a Monday because we feed them daily. The girl, who had that litter you took away over the December holidays, had another litter in May/June. Last week, the girl had a massive hole on the top of her head, myself and a colleague were putting cream on her. The boy (big one - who is the loveliest thing ever, I have named him Bear), has cuts all over his face and the little one was here the one morning for food and water and he had a wire wrapped around his neck with a long piece of wire - so what they are doing, one doesn't know. As the two dogs were jumping up aggressively, trying to bite our staff member, one of the staff members of JRE jumped out his truck and tried to shew them back to the company but I told him to take a hike as I was going to feed them. (I had just pulled up) - I noticed that they were shaking after that.

I know you guys have so many animals on your premises - if I could take the big one, I would - I already have two rescue dogs at home and I don't think that I could have 'Bear' transitioned in with them at this stage.

These animals are being abused, they are being tied up with wires, they are not fed or given water, full of cuts and holes in heads and full of oil.

Please can we treat this matter as urgent now and take some action in sorting it out? I know you guys are busy - I know you have told me not to feed them but honestly, how do I look at a starving animal and not feed it - I am never going to do that. A judge in a court should understand that.
