Good morning Jaco

I am here again with huge concern. Pitbull at 5 Zeezicht Close, Richwood
The tenants next door have fled the property for non payment of rent.
We had sent numerous complaints to law enforcement as Storm barked non stop through the day and night and was attacking the remaining puppy constantly.
On Sunday I contacted Law enforcement again as we had no sleep on Saturday night with Storm continuously barking.
I went to the wall and called Martin who is the new tenant there to ask him what is going on.
He said the previous owners (Charmaine, her husband and son) have left the property and left all the belongings etc there and not returned since friday.
He said he does not know what to do as they were supposed to come and remove the stuff aswell as the dog.
We did not know that the grandpa was still left in the room downstairs and he must have alerted his grandson "the owner of the dogs" and the drug addict child, of what we were talking about, and that we had contacted law enforcement.
Later that afternoon, about 15:00, the tenant went out in his car and a few seconds after that the son pulled up in a car with 3 others and ran in and got Storm and then drove off again.
The new tenant was not aware that Storm had been removed while he was out and Law enforcement came to the property on monday to follow up on the complaint as I had stipulated the complaints have been from March last year to date
with the non stop barking. Charmaine had said then, it is not her dog so she can not do anything about it.
Now the puppy is left stranded and the new tenant says it is aggressive toward them.
Charmaine and her family had neglected these dogs from the beginning, hence our complaints continuously with yourselves and law enforcement.
The pup is now stranded there and there is nothing Law enforcement can do.
Is there anything you can do to help this poor puppy be removed and rehabilitated to eventually get a loving home?
I have even contacted pitbull rescue with no luck and gave law enforcement Charmaine's number to try and get the necessary permission to surrender the puppy.
But who knows how long the process will take
