Comments by Inspector:

Officer Yaaseen and I inspected the sale yard and were accompanied by Cadet Inspectors Clodeen and Julian. The total number of animals present at the sale yard was approximately 350 cattle, 300 sheep, and 60 goats. I issued the following for animals that were compromised but that I couldn't insist on slaughtering: Warning 0203 to Xolile Same to provide treatment or slaughter to sheep with eye conditions; Warning 0207 to Ameredien Abubakah to provide treatment to the sheep with a wound in the mouth; Warning 0208 to Chris Bruyns to provide treatment or slaughter to the sheep with an eye condition; and Warning 0209 to Erhard Strooh to provide treatment or slaughter to sheep with hind leg lameness. Before the auction, I was permitted to perform emergency slaughter on two compromised sheep due to their severe conditions (1 with a wounded udder & the other with an old break in the hip region). This action was taken to ensure the welfare of the animals. Officer Yaaseen Abrahams issued the following notices for failure to humanely euthanize compromised animals: Notice C1/28931/807/058790 to A. Ameerodien, Notice C1/28930/807/058788 to Chris Bruyns, and Notice C1/28932/807/058792 to Xolile Same. The inspection revealed some welfare concerns and various warnings and notices were issued to relevant parties accordingly. Further to this, the emergency slaughter of two sheep was carried out to prevent unnecessary suffering. The team will continue to monitor compliance with animal welfare regulations at the sale yard.
