Comments by Inspector:

Accompanied by Inspector Taljaard, we were granted access to conduct an inspection by the Ockert Kruger. As we walked onto the camp, there was a smell of rotting flesh. He showed us where the smell was coming from. Slightly away from the dogs's enclosure was all the waste from the weekend, of which Ockert was in the process of loading onto his vehicle to go dump at the time of our arrival.

He invited us into the dogs' enclosure, and the pack started attacking me, i quickly got out before getting severely bitten.

We then asked Ockert to bring each dog to us to examine.

80% of the dogs are still overweight. Otherwise, they are alert and without signs of discomfort.

We observed a female Bassett hound dog named Lillibeth with a fresh gash on its face that had apparently happened this morning. We also observed a brown female cross breed 16 years old dog named Bessy with a growth hanging from her abdomen.
