Comments by Inspector:

Upon our arrival to the sale yard, we found they had already separated injured animals, 1 goat with a prolapse, and larger sheep with an old broken front leg that it couldn't put any weight on. We spoke to Carl explaining the animals were suffering and needed to be slaughtered immediately. He then organised that those ones be sold first, and I performed emergency slaughter on them and the buyers then took the carcass. After that, I issued a warning for the owner to provide a sheep with a condition affecting its eye and a sheep with a condition affecting its front leg to receive treatment as there were not enough grounds to insist on slaughter and the animals could still be transported (this was verified with colleagues first). Warning 0210 was issued to Boyce Mcume to provide the sheep with treatment or send proof of slaughter, and Warning 0211 was issued to Mncedisi Sipambo to provide a sheep with treatment or send proof of slaughter. There were 300 cattle, 400 sheep and 35 goats at the sale yard.
