Environmental enrichment _____

PROTECTION:

Animals not only have to be protected from theft but also from negative human influences such as the teasing and chasing of the animals.

Animal supervision _____
Interaction between the public and animals must be under strict supervision to ensure the animals are not teased, chased, frightened or stressed in any manner

Enclosure supervision _____
Adequate supervision must be provided to ensure that animals are not exposed, either deliberately or negligently, to harmful products such as cigarettes, litter, broken glass, potentially harmful foodstuffs or uncontrolled feeding programmes

Birds of prey _____
In areas where birds of prey may pose a threat, sufficient vegetation such as trees and shrubs, under which the small stock can hide will minimise the threat and offer protection

Fractions animals _____
Animals must be protected from bullying and aggression from other animals, including those of their own species. Frantic or aggressive animals must be housed separately or disposed of humanely

Noise and people _____
Animals must be protected from unacceptable noise levels such as loud music, high-frequency noises and fireworks. All animals should have an appropriate area in which they can retreat to away from direct contact with the public and other animals

FEED ROOMS
