No unmarked animals allowed to roam on farm. If you are the owner of animals you need to keep them fenced in and mark them if they should get out.

SPCA said if geese get killed in paddocks where horses eat no one can be blamed for that as you as the owner should keep your geese safe and enclosed.

All animals should be marked clearly.

No one will be liable for any unmarked animals roaming on the farm getting lost, killed a (like geese getting stepped on as they are in horse paddocks) If geese poses a threat to any horse, by going for their eyes while eating, we are allowed to remove them as per SPCA

From today onwards NO roaming of unmarked animals.

Leg bands: Use reusable, clip-together bands in different sizes that can be swapped out as the geese grow. You can also use non-toxic, colored zip ties that are easier to remove than some other types.

Leg/wing/neck bands: These allow for individual identification from a distance without having to catch the bird. However, researchers advise against using neck bands because they may have a negative impact on survival.
