STABLES

Size and Number of Stables 13, Approximaely 4x4m
Should be a minimum of 3.6 m x 3.6 m for an average size horse (15-16hh)

Description of Stables Sheet metal, wood & shade cloth
E.g. Solid Brick to roof with Double Front Door and Window

Damage caused by horses? None observed
Look for signs of behaviour problems in horses – where stables have been chewed or doors or floors kicked

Suitability of Doors Wide enough, no obstructions
Are doors wide enough not to touch horses hips on entry/exit High enough not to touch the ears and head

Maintenance of Stables No hazards observed
Well maintained no harmful features Minor maintenance required Poorly maintained/harmful features (describe)

Is there suitable artificial lighting? No artificial lighting
Fluorescent lighting when needed Spotlight when needed

Recommended to avoid errors in feeding

Is there a feed board? No
Especially where there are many horses feed boards record what horses should be fed when and what

Is medication stored separately from feed area? Yes
Preferable to avoid contamination

Do horses have rest days and replacements? Yes, horses are generally rotated daily
Especially trail ride horses need to have rest time. There should be replacement horses in the event of injury/illness

Describe work terrain? Mountainous trail
e.g. Mountain trail and beach Level sand roads Gravel Roads Arenas with jumps

Protection from abuse? Owner supervises and handles the horses
What measures are in place to prevent abuse or mistreatment (i.e. overweight riders/ abusive riders/

Fitting between the saddle and the horse these must be clean and soft to provided good padding/comfort

Type of bits are used? Snaffles

Bit and bridle condition and cleanliness? Good and clean condition
Typically Snaffle Bits (which are generally milder) No sharp edges on joins or rings

Equipment should be washed regularly and replaced when worn
