Comments and action taken by Inspector:

Upon my arrival, I met with Abigail who was already busy with crates. I inspected 3 x crates - one containing medium crossbreed dog, one containing a bullterrier puppy, and another containing a daschund puppy. Whilst I was taking notes, the bullterrier's owner already came to collect the crate. The bullterrier had been provided with a blanket as bedding but had pushed it into the corner of the crate. I was going to ask Abigail to fix the blanket for the puppy, but then his owner came to collect him and confirmed he'd be removed from the cat and be kept inside the car with the man. No other actionable concerns were observed during my inspection. I began my inspection at Bidair Petlounge at 12:45 and my inspection concluded at 13:06.
