



VETERINARY REPORT

To whom it may concern, the below animal was brought to the SPCA as a surrender by Inspector Julian from 1 Azalea court, Ocean View.

ANIMAL DETAILS

EXAMINATION FINDINGS

All vital parameters were within normal limits.
According to the Nestlé PURINA Body Condition Score, the body condition score was 3.5/9.
The puppy was non-weight bearing on the left front leg and showed reluctance to walk. The entire left front leg was swollen and asymmetrical in comparison to the right leg. Puncture wounds were evident on the medial aspect of the left distal front leg. On examination of this wound, pus was found to pour out the wound excessively.

A radiograph was taken: severe complete fracture of the left distal radius and severe complete oblique fracture of the left distal ulna, that is also severely displaced.

This dog had presence of excessive fleas.

COMMENTS

Upon examination of the affected left leg, the dog exhibited signs of pain and distress, necessitating sedation to proceed with further evaluation. Based on the radiograph, the above-mentioned fractures were noted. A significant amount of physical force is required to fracture a bone, which occurs when the force applied exceeds the bone's strength. It is clear that this animal sustained severe trauma and endured an exceptional amount of pain. The presence of pus indicates that the wound was infected. Unfortunately, this animal was not provided with pain medication or timely veterinary intervention to address the pain, prevent infection or stabilize the broken leg. As a result, the animal suffered extreme pain and distress. Given the circumstances, humane euthanasia was recommended to prevent further suffering.
