NOTES

- In terms of Section 1 of the Performing Animals Protection Act 24 of 1935 as amended all circuses are required to obtain a licence for exhibition and training or performing animals and use of animals for safeguarding.
- Check that the performance licence relates to the requirements of all sections within section 3F and PAPA regulations 2016 (this will contain details of what must be on the license)
- In terms of Section 5 of the Act, should a circus not be in possession of the relevant documentation as referred to in the Performing Animals Protection Act Regulations 2016, performances are to be cancelled until these permits are issued. Any circus that does not comply may be reported to the National Licencing officer to pursue charges in terms of Section 8 of the act.

Section 5 Obstruction of police officer

Any person who wilfully obstructs, delays or otherwise interferes with a police officer in the exercise of the powers herein granted, or who conceals any animal with intent to defeat the exercise of such powers, or otherwise hampers or impedes the exercise of such powers, is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding R20 000 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding five years in addition to any other penalty imposed for the contravention of any provision of this Act or any regulations made thereunder.

ANIMAL ACCOMMODATION

NOTES FOR CHECK LIST

- Check on all living conditions: - size and conditions of cages, bedding used, type of feed and watering facilities used and adequate sheltering facilities. Check cleanliness of cages, stalls etc. Report excessive flies, bad smell etc. Check that adequate precautions have been taken to protect the animals against the elements such as wind chill, rain, heat or cold.
- Water to be freely available. Often watering is reliant on handlers, with animals showing thirst when offered food. Only when an animal refuses to drink water has it had sufficient.

Note: Such refusal to drink can also be a symptom of illness. Water may be withheld up to an hour prior to a performance. However water should be freely available at all other times.

- Shelter
Animals such as horses, camels and elephants in circuses do not have the same freedom of movement as free-ranging animals with access to natural shade or shelter. Therefore, effective artificial shelter must be provided, as these animals may be more susceptible to the possible effects of a chilling or cold wind, rain or heat stress from the sun. Where natural shelterbelts and trees do not provide protection from adverse weather suitable artificial shelter must be provided.

- Position of animal trailers / accommodation:

How far from the following: Music (Speakers, microphones) Not seen during inspection

Roads: ± 50m away

Noise (generators, coolers, etc) None running during the inspection

Fumes: Vehicles switched off during inspection.

Are members of the public allowed to walk around freely amongst trailers?

No, this is a restricted area and only staff is allowed there.

TRANSPORTATION

ARRIVAL

- Check general condition of animals on arrival. Any transport injuries? Not inspected, already set up.

- Observe offloading procedures and length of time before animals are offloaded and / or fed and watered.

- Check that water is made available to the animals immediately after arrival.

Clean water was available upon inspection.

- Rest period before performance Couple of hours
- Length of travel between venues ± 1h 30 min

DEPARTURE

- Check all transport vehicles prior to the circus departing to next venue. Pay particular attention to the flooring.

Did not inspect

- Observe loading of animals into transport vehicles. Report goading of animals.

- Check that animals are not left in cages on the transport vehicles for long periods without shelter from the elements.

Did not inspect

- Check that animals have been watered prior to journey. (Depending on the length of the journey).

OBSERVING PERFORMING ANIMALS

- Check to see how the animals enter the arena (are they goaded with whips or do they enter willingly?).

Did not inspect

Example: Inexperienced animals entering the arena are sometimes initially blinded by the intense spotlights as well as startled by the music over the loudspeakers.

- Check where animals are held just prior to the performance and the length of the time they are kept there after their performance.

All except large cats are kept in enclosures. Large cats are kept in trailers 15min before the show. They are there for ±30 min

- Check to see if animals are enticed with food or are goaded to ensure that they perform.

Did not inspect.

- Check to see if any drugs are administered to the animals.

None observed - Not being done according to the owner

- Nature of tricks and behaviours each animal is asked to perform during their routine.

Interact with handlers. Take food/meat out of handlers mouth. Does tricks.

NOTE: Always have two SPCA officials observe a performance: - one official observing the animals backstage and the second, observing the animals being taken back to the pens. Check that the equipment and apparatus used on or for animals are humane and in good state of repair.
