On the 05/06/07 I was requested to do a post mortem examination of animal that died overnight at the SPCA. This animal was confiscated from it's owner on 20/06/25 from 26 Ajax Way Woodlands, 7786.

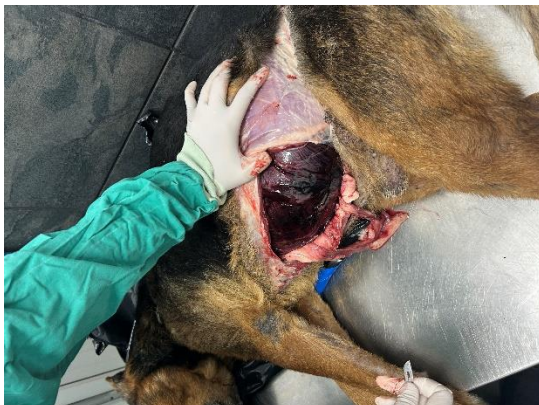
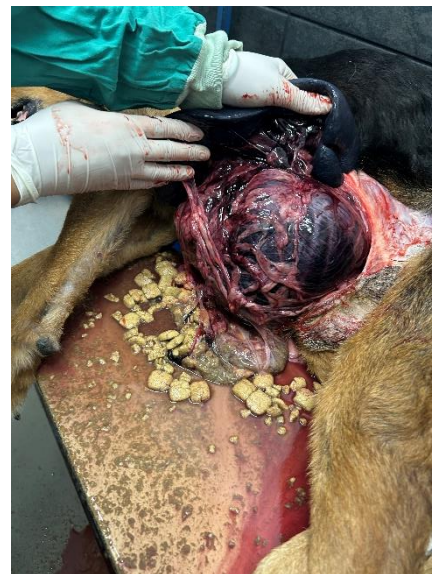
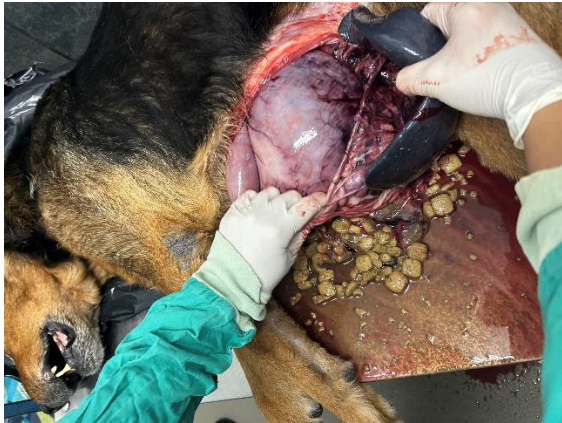

EXAMINATION FINDINGS

- **Description** of the condition:
 - Animal was found with a large distended abdomen, abdomen was firm.
 - A large gas and fluid dilated stomach was found with entrapment of the gastro-splenic ligament.
 - Stomach was grossly haemorrhagic and twisted on it's axis, the degree of torsion was severe resulting in vascular compromise to gastric wall, evident by the haemorrhagic and congested mucosa.
 - Stomach contents included partial digested pellets
 - The spleen was displaced and engorged.
- **Cause of death: Gastric Dilatation and Volvulus (GDV)**
Animal likely died of hypovolaemic shock caused by GDV
- **Duration** of the condition: Acute death
- **Prognosis** – GRAVE
