There 2 adult sheep and a lamb that were dead, according to Moebarick the sheep were struggling to pass the stools, as they were not used to the feed that was given to them, there was food as roughage, the lurcene and there was water. Moederick told me that, he will slaughter the 2 bulls at approximately 14h00, he mentioned that, he made arrangements with the family to meet him by thst time. He agreed that, we pre stun the cattles before he cut them, at the begging there was handling issues, then I have addressed the concern, the handler complied by carrying the sheep in a proper way.

Describe the handling if inhumane At the begging the handler were pulling the sheep by its legs, I have stopped them and explained the proper way to carry sheep
