Subject: RE: CoGH SPCA: Animal cruelty REPORT!

Dear Karen

Thank you for reporting your concerns to the Cape of Good Hope SPCA. We appreciate members of the public who remain vigilant in the protection of animals.

An inspector attended the property to investigate the concerns raised. The occupant of the premises denied the allegations but allowed the inspector full access to conduct a welfare inspection.

During the inspection, the following observations were made:

Three dogs were found roaming freely within the property. They had access to clean drinking water and shelter. All dogs appeared to be in good physical condition, with no signs of injury, pain, limping, or distress. Their behaviour did not indicate any fear or anxiety.

Two cats were also present and found to be in fair condition, with access to clean water and shelter. One of the cats, previously reported to be underweight, had been taken to a veterinary practice for examination. The veterinarian advised a wet food diet appropriate to the cat's age. Upon reinspection, the cat's condition had notably improved.

Although no evidence was found during the visit to substantiate the claim that a dog was thrown against a wall and left unable to move, a formal warning was issued. The warning noted the serious nature of the allegation and advised that, should the SPCA obtain evidence supporting such a claim in future, appropriate legal action will be taken.

We remain committed to upholding the welfare of all animals and will continue to monitor where necessary.
