FINDINGS

Confinement of animal/s: Tethered ***
Reason for being chained or caged: property is not entirely fenced and the dog also jumps the wall
Adequate space: Yes
Clean living environment: No ***
Water available: Yes
Adequate shelter available: Yes
Animal/s in good condition: Yes

Upon arrival, myself and Inspector Davids introduced ourselves and explained explained that we are going door-to-door conducting routine inspections. The owner Mr. Moegamat Arendse then allowed us access to the property.

Upon entering the property, we observed one cat that appeared to be in a good condition and the owner informed us that the cat sleeps inside the house. there was water available as well and adequate space for the cat to roam on the property. The owner told us that he would like to have the cat sterilised and we told him that is fine and upon follow-up on the property we will collect the cat to be sterilised.

We also observed a Pitbull type dog named Tyson kept on a short tether with a chain as a makeshift collar, I told the owner that he needs to procure a collar for the dog to avoid an embedded collar and injury to the dogs neck. The owner explained that the dog jumps over the wall and the property is not adequately fenced either. There was adequate shelter for the dog in the form of a kennel, there was also water available to the dog. We observe empty beer bottles on the right side of the kennel and we explained to the owner that this possess hazard to the dog and needs to be removed.

We then explained that the dog also needs to be placed on a running chain to allow it adequate space to roam and to also express natural behavior. We will collect the dog on the same day as the other sterilisations to be collected.

furthermore, there is adequate space in the living environment for the cat and the dog and it appeared to be clean as well.

A warning was issued by Inspector Davids to:

1. Remove the hazardous material from the living environment within 7 days.
2. place the dog named tyson on a running chain within 7 days and get a collar within 7 days as well.

Legislation:

Section 2(1)(b) of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962 for tethering the dog in such a manner which does not afford adequate space.
