FINDINGS

Confinement of animal/s: Caged - inadequate space ***
Reason for being chained or caged: hawking site
Adequate space: No ***
Clean living environment: Yes
Water available: Yes, but dirty / not potable ***
Adequate shelter available: No ***
Animal/s in good condition: Yes

Upon arrival, Inspector David's and I introduced ourselves to the worker and informed her that we would like to conduct a pro-active inspection at the hawking site. We observed 11 chickens in the hawker's cage. There were large white chickens in the left side of the cage that were to big for the top cage and we suggested that they be put in the middle section.

We did not observe any water available to the chickens , the other section of the cage did not appear to be overcrowded and the living environment for all the chickens was reasonably clean as well. No protruding wires were observed or objects that may cause any harm to the chickens. There was also a

plastic cover over the top of the cage to provide cover and protection to the chickens but we explained to the hawker that the cover should not be semi-transparent it must stop sun also so that they are adequately protected. We checked the chickens and no veterinary concerns were observed during the inspection.

We explained the concerns that we had observed to the worker and what she would need to implement to rectify those concerns.

Inspector David's issued a warning to:

1. Ensure water is available at all times.
2. Ensure chickens are not overcrowded and that they are not too large for the cages.
3. Ensure there is adequate covering to protect from weather conditions.
