To whom it may concern

I performed a veterinary clinical examination on Annabella Alcock on Monday, 22/09/2025. During this assessment, her vital signs (Temperature, heart rate, respiration rate) were all within normal limits. She had a thinner coat than is expected for a husky, but it should be taken into account the owner's mention of her having had a similar issue with her coat for most of her life, as well as her advanced age, that this may be within normal for the patient.

Annabella is underweight for her size, however, given that she is over 12 years of age, and geriatric weight-loss is prevalent after such time, it is not unexpected. Her spine and hips were easily palpated, as well as her ribs, with some muscle wastage. This may be due to age, or some other underlying issue.

Upon testing Annabella's blood for a minor medial profile, no obvious biochemical abnormalities other than a low hemoglobin and a slight elevation of one liver enzyme (ALP) was notable in the results.

Annabella is being fed Hills Science Diet for senior pets, as well as Husky soft food tins. This diet should be sufficient for a patient of advanced age, but I suggested supplementing with Hills k/d soft food as well, as this may aid in reducing muscle mass loss, and is a nutrient-dense food that supports geriatric patient and those with reduced appetite. Mr Alcock acknowledged this, and purchased some soft food tins to take home.

Annabella is not currently on any chronic medication, but has now been prescribed 125mg paracetamol BID, as well as Epleptin 100mg BID, for arthritic pain.

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After a conversation regarding Annabella's quality of life, I felt that Annabella is still enjoying most things that gives her good quality of life, dignity and is enjoyable for her as a dog.

Given the above information, based on my assessment of the patient clinically, blood tests performed, as well as information supplied by the owner, I would consider Annabella clinically underweight but overall healthy, besides some arthritic pain and a poor coat, which may have undiagnosed or genetic factors at play. I feel that Annabella is being fed a nutritious diet that can easily be supplemented to support her more, is struggling likely with weight loss and arthritic pain due to advanced age primarily, which may or may not have other factors at play. The age-related weight and condition loss can be remedied to a certain degree, through some dietary supplementation of food sources. the arthritic pain may be curbed through medical pain management.

Annabella can still have a good quality of life and enjoy the many aspects of a happy home for a dog, with these adjustments.

I do advised that if anything were to change, if Annabella were to continue losing weight or pain should worsen despite the efforts mentioned above, Annabella should return to the vet for further diagnostics, and/or to reassess her quality of life.
