CLINICAL REPORT

Patient: THOR, 5 year old German Shepard

Thor presented for veterinary examination on 9 January 2026, as requested by an SPCA Inspector (Letter dated 08/01/2026) to assess for pain

Clinical examination found Thor to be in low body condition (BCS 3/9), but does not appear to be in obvious pain.

Mobility was normal, without lameness.

Habitus and mentation was normal

Chest auscultation and abdominal palpation was all normal. Abdominal gut loops felt a bit gassy, and he is recovering from a recent episode of diarrhoea.

Thor is a client of our practice, and underwent thorough clinical testing in early 2024 to determine the cause of his thin condition. No obvious cause was found, but parasites and pancreatic insufficiency were ruled out.

His recent chronic diarrhoea is most likely attributable to inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) for which he is under treatment with medication and dietary modification, as discussed with the owner.

He has also been treated against internal parasites.

He will be rechecked in 1 month's time again.
