



To whom it may concern,

I, Dr Danielle Hannekom of West Beach Animal Hospital, present this letter as substantial proof that the following Fallen Angels patients have been overseen by myself for the following medical conditions.

Skippy

At the time of Inspector David's inspection, Skippy was still in isolation, as Skippy was collected from an area with other puppies that had tested positive for Parvo virus. Since Skippy was not showing any clinical signs of illness, Fallen Angels kept Skippy in isolation on the farm for 14 days before brining him to my practice. Skippy tested positive for Ehrlichia which he is now being treated for. He's been eating well, been groomed and has overall been doing well.

Flower

Flower was x-rayed at our practice on 03/10/2024. Flower has an old, healed fracture on the radius of the elbow as well as severe Osteoarthritis of the elbow. She is on chronic pain medication and I do believe that she has a decent quality of life on the pain medication that she is currently on and receives a repeat script monthly.

Pumpkin

Pumpkin is a young cat with recurrent eye infections which I suspect is Herpes virus related as it tends to flare up time to time. When it does flare up Fallen Angels reports to me straight away and I dispense medication or he comes in for a consult. We are aware of the case but due to it being suspected Herpes virus related, as I say, does tend to flare up from time to time.

Nala (previously known as “Dragon”)

Nala has been seen by myself before for sneezing. I have contacted Fallen Angels since your inspection, and they will be bringing him into me again to see if anything more can be done for this condition.

Zola

Zola came in with a very bad scar on the top of her head and really bad caked, gunky eyes which we have been treating as dry eye with lubricating eye drops on a chronic basis. I was going to consider operating on her eyelids which tend to roll in when her eyes get inflamed. However, she had been doing really well on the drops alone and her eyelids were not rolling in when her eye weren't inflamed so that was put on hold. However, I will re-examine her again to make sure she doesn't need Entropion surgery, but she is on chronic eye drops for the dry eye, hence from time to time her eyes do tend to get a little bit mucky. Her skin is treated and healed but she has remained permanently bald in some areas so her coat is sparse. However, she is a million times better than she was when she first came in. She's no longer itchy and we have ruled out mange and any kind of skin infection.
