Do hereby make oath in English and state that

1. I am an adult male Cadet Inspector employed as such by the Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals ("SPCA") at corner of 1st Avenue and First Road, Grassy Park with contact telephone number/s 021 700 4158/9 or 083 326 2377 and with email address insp7@spca-ct.co.za.
2. The facts contained herein fall within my personal knowledge, unless the contrary appears from the context or is expressly indicated otherwise, and are, to the best of my knowledge and belief, both true and correct.
3. Where necessary, I have relied on my own observations and on information obtained during the course of my investigation, which I reasonably believe to be true and correct. Insofar as I rely on information provided by third parties, I shall endeavour to procure confirmatory affidavits from such persons.
4. To the extent that such confirmatory affidavits are not obtained, I respectfully request that this Honourable Court exercise its discretion in terms of section 3 of the Law of Evidence Amendment Act, 45 of 1998, to admit such evidence in the interests of justice.
5. All annexures referred to herein are incorporated into this affidavit by reference. These include photographic evidence, which has not been altered, edited, or manipulated in any manner, and which is submitted to accurately depict the conditions prevailing at the time of inspection.
6. I further state that the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals operates in terms of the Societies for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 169 of 1993 ("the SPCAs Act"), which regulates its powers and functions. The said Act empowers the SPCA, inter alia, to take cognisance of the application of laws affecting animals and to make representations to the appropriate authorities in that regard.
7. I took over the case and investigation from Inspector Jeffrey Mfini. At the time of the handover, I familiarised myself with the contents of the case file, including all prior inspection reports, warning notices issued, photographic evidence, and the history of complaints received by the Cape of Good Hope SPCA.

I, Jonathan Siviwe Noko, do hereby make further oath in English and state that:

8. From my review, it was evident that the matter involved ongoing non-compliance by the owner, repeated concerns regarding the welfare of the animals, and allegations of neglect, lack of adequate veterinary care, and continuous fighting between the dogs resulting in injury.
9. On 14 March 2026, I attended at the property to conduct an inspection. Upon arrival, I called out, but no one responded.
10. From the gate, I observed two adult dogs and one puppy. The puppy displayed old scars on its face; however, I did not observe any fresh injuries at that stage.
11. The brown/tan female dog appeared underweight and presented as a dog that had recently given birth.
12. I issued a Notice to Comply, No. 15550 (attached hereto as Annexure "A10"), which required the owner to take immediate corrective action.
13. In the said notice, it was recorded that the puppy had allegedly been attacked by an adult dog. Based on the visible scarring, it was evident that there had been a failure to prevent repeated injury, thereby exposing the animal to unnecessary suffering.
14. The owner was instructed to immediately separate the dogs or surrender one dog to the SPCA in order to prevent further attacks and suffering. The owner was further advised that failure to comply, and any continued fighting between the dogs, could result in further legal action.
15. The owner was also instructed to provide the brown/tan female dog with adequate nutrition on a daily basis, as she appeared underweight.
16. Having regard to the condition of the animals, the history of complaints, and the repeated incidents of fighting, I formed the opinion that further legal intervention was necessary, including the possible seizure of the animals.
17. I contacted the complainant, who confirmed that she hears the dogs fighting on a daily basis.
18. The Notice to Comply was affixed to the gate, as no person was present.
19. On 20 March 2026, I returned to the property to verify compliance with the Notice to Comply. Upon arrival, I observed that the Notice to Comply had been removed from the gate.
20. The dogs had not been separated and remained together, contrary to the instructions issued. The brown/tan female dog continued to appear underweight and appeared to have recently given birth.
21. I again called out, but no one responded. I observed fresh dog faeces in the front area of the property. From my position outside the property, I was unable to observe any shelter or drinking water.
22. I took photographs to document the continued non-compliance and the ongoing risk posed to the puppy by the adult dog.

I, **Jonathan Siviwe Noko**, do hereby make further oath in English and state that:

23. Based on the above, I formed the reasonable belief that the welfare and safety of the animals remained compromised. I accordingly recommended that an application be made for a warrant in terms of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962 to enter the property and seize the animals.
24. On 24 March 2026, I attended at the Mitchells Plain Magistrates' Court and applied for a warrant. The warrant was duly authorised (attached hereto as Annexure "A11").
25. I proceeded to the property accompanied by Law Enforcement officers to execute the warrant. Upon arrival, I called out and a minor male came outside. Upon enquiry, he informed me that his father, the owner, was at work.
26. I contacted the owner telephonically and informed him of the execution of the warrant. He indicated that he was at work and initially unable to attend. I informed him that we would proceed; however, he thereafter indicated that he would attend shortly.
27. The owner arrived shortly thereafter, and the warrant was explained to him. He queried the notices previously issued, stating that he had only received one. I advised him that any further queries could be addressed at the SPCA offices.
28. I proceeded to seize the animals. At the time of seizure:
 - a. The puppy had an open wound on its face, indicative of a recent injury;
 - b. The female dog was underweight and had six puppies;
 - c. The male dog exhibited signs of a skin condition;
 - d. The living environment, particularly at the rear of the property, was dirty and unhygienic, with a notable presence of flies.
29. I confirm that the complaint regarding unhygienic conditions and the presence of flies was substantiated upon inspection.
30. Despite prior interventions and multiple notices issued, the owner remained non-compliant, resulting in continued and unnecessary suffering of the animals.
31. A seizure notice, No. 01806 (attached hereto as Annexure "A12"), was issued to the owner, who signed same in acknowledgement of receipt. A copy of the warrant and seizure notice was handed to the owner.
32. I thereafter proceeded to Lentegour Police Station, where the seizure was recorded under OB 13/03/2026.
33. Using my cellular phone, a Samsung A256E, I took photographs of my observations. These photographs are contained in the following albums:
 - a. Album H: 14 March 2026
 - b. Album I: 20 March 2026
 - c. Album J: 24 March 2026
34. The photographs are a true and accurate representation of my observations and have not been altered, edited, or enhanced in any manner.
35. In light of the above, I respectfully request that criminal charges be investigated and instituted against the owner for contraventions of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962, specifically:

I, **Jonathan Siviwe Noko**, do hereby make further oath in English and state that:

a. Section 2(1)(a) – for neglecting the animals;

(a) overloads, overdrives, overrides, ill-treats, neglects, infuriates, tortures or maims or cruelly beats, kicks, goads or terrifies any animal, or causes or procures or, being the owner, permits any of these things to be done;

b. Section 2(1)(e) – for failing to render or procure adequate veterinary treatment;

(e) being the owner of any animal, deliberately or negligently keeps such animal in a dirty or parasitic condition or allows it to become infested with external parasites or fails to render or procure veterinary or other medical treatment or attention which he is able to render or procure for any such animal in need of such treatment or attention, whether through disease, delivery of young or any other cause, or fails to destroy or cause to be destroyed any such animal which is so seriously injured or diseased or in such a physical condition that to prolong its life would be cruel and would cause such animal unnecessary suffering;

c. Section 2(1)(q) and (r) – for the commission and/or omission of acts resulting in unnecessary suffering.

(q) causes, procures or assists in the commission or omission of any act of cruelty, or any act or omission which causes unnecessary suffering to any animal;

and

(r) by wantonly or unreasonably doing or omitting to do any act, or causing or procuring the commission or omission of any act, causes any unnecessary suffering to any animal;

AFFIDAVIT

1. I am an adult male Inspector employed as such by the Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals ("SPCA") at corner of 1st Avenue and First Road, Grassy Park with contact telephone number/s 021 700 4158/9 or 083 326 2377 and with email address insp7@spca-ct.co.za.
2. The facts contained herein fall within my personal knowledge, unless the contrary appears from the context or is expressly indicated otherwise, and are, to the best of my knowledge and belief, both true and correct.
3. Where necessary, I have relied on my own observations and on information obtained during the course of my investigation, which I reasonably believe to be true and correct. Insofar as I rely on information provided by third parties, I shall endeavour to procure confirmatory affidavits from such persons.
4. To the extent that such confirmatory affidavits are not obtained, I respectfully request that this Honourable Court exercise its discretion in terms of section 3 of the Law of Evidence Amendment Act, 45 of 1998, to admit such evidence in the interests of justice.
5. All annexures referred to herein are incorporated into this affidavit by reference. These include photographic evidence, which has not been altered, edited, or manipulated in any manner, and which is submitted to accurately depict the conditions prevailing at the time of inspection.
6. I further state that the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals operates in terms of the Societies for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 169 of 1993 ("the SPCAs Act"), which regulates its powers and functions. The said Act empowers the SPCA, inter alia, to take cognisance of the application of laws affecting animals and to make representations to the appropriate authorities in that regard.
7. On 05 January 2026, the Cape of Good Hope SPCA received a complaint regarding a property situated at 125 Montclair Drive, Mandalay (hereinafter referred to as "the property"). The complaint alleged that dogs at the property had been neglected for approximately one week, that there was faeces and waste throughout the premises, that the dogs were fighting with one another, and that they had been deprived of food and water for an extended period.
8. On 08 January 2026, my colleague, Inspector Lwazi Ntungele, attended at the property to conduct an inspection. Upon arrival, no person was present. Inspector Ntungele

I, Jeffrey Mfini, further state under oath and in English that:

observed two dogs from the gate and issued a warning notice (No. 24109), instructing the owner to contact the SPCA within 18 hours.

9. On 09 January 2026, I attended at the property to conduct a follow-up inspection. Upon arrival, I knocked and called out, but received no response. From the gate, I observed two adult dogs described as follows:
 - a. One male Pitbull-type dog (unsterilised), black and white in colour, name unknown, which appeared to be developing a skin condition on its lower back;
 - b. One female Africanis-type dog, tan and white in colour, name unknown, in fair condition.
10. Both dogs appeared to be infested with fleas and flies. From outside the property, I observed silver food bowls. The front living environment appeared clean, and shelter was visible from the front of the house.
11. I issued warning notice No. 24028 (attached hereto as Annexure "A7"), requiring the following:
 - a. That adequate shelter be provided within 7 days;
 - b. That both dogs be taken to a veterinarian for treatment within 72 hours.
12. The notice was affixed to the gate, as no person was present.
13. On 13 January 2026, I returned to the property and met with Mr Thando Mlungwana (ID No. 7804235634084), who identified himself as the owner of the dogs (hereinafter referred to as "the owner").
14. During the inspection, I observed three dogs described as follows:
 - a. One male Pitbull-type dog (unsterilised) named "Spike" (black and white), exhibiting a developing skin condition and ticks;
 - b. One female Africanis-type dog named "Bobby" (tan and white), in fair condition but infested with ticks and fleas;
 - c. One juvenile Pitbull-type dog named "Trixie" (black and white), with noticeable scars and bite marks around the face.
15. The owner informed me that the injuries sustained by the juvenile dog were caused by an attack from the dog "Spike". I observed that the dogs did not have adequate shelter and that the living environment at the rear of the property was unclean.
16. I issued warning notice No. 24037 (attached hereto as Annexure "A8"), requiring the owner to:
 - a. Seek veterinary treatment for all dogs for external parasites within 5 days;
 - b. Provide adequate shelter within 5 days;
 - c. Clean and maintain the living environment in a hygienic condition at all times.
17. On 21 January 2026, I conducted a further inspection and was granted access to the property by the owner.
18. I again observed the three dogs in substantially the same condition as previously described. The dogs continued to suffer from ticks and fleas, and the male dog "Spike" still exhibited a worsening skin condition.

I, Jeffrey Mfini, further state under oath and in English that:

19. The owner informed me that he had purchased deworming medication instead of tick and flea treatment. I explained that the medication purchased was not suitable for external parasites. The owner stated that he had been given the incorrect medication.
20. It was agreed that the owner would obtain appropriate tick and flea treatment and construct adequate shelter by the end of the month.
21. On 30 January 2026, I conducted a follow-up inspection. No person was present at the property.
22. From the gate, I observed the three dogs roaming freely within the property. The juvenile dog did not present with any new injuries and only displayed healed scars. Food and water were present, and the front living environment appeared clean.
23. On 06 February 2026, I conducted a further inspection. No person was present.
24. From the gate, I observed that the juvenile dog had sustained new bite wounds to the face, which appeared swollen and bleeding. It is my belief that the dog had again been attacked by the adult male dog.
25. The dog "Spike" appeared to have a worsening skin condition, now affecting the tail area. Water was present and the front area appeared clean; however, adequate shelter had still not been provided.
26. I contacted the owner telephonically and informed him of the deteriorating condition of the animals. The owner downplayed the severity of the injuries, claiming that they were old wounds, despite visible bleeding.
27. I issued warning notice No. 24223 (attached hereto as Annexure "A9"), requiring the owner to:
 - a. Provide adequate shelter within 48 hours;
 - b. Seek immediate veterinary treatment for the dogs "Spike" and "Trixie" within 48 hours;
 - c. Remove one of the dogs, either by surrendering it to the SPCA or rehoming it, to prevent further fighting and injury.
28. On 09 February 2026, I conducted a follow-up inspection and met with the owner. I observed significant improvement in the condition of the dogs. The owner had obtained NexGard treatment and had provided suitable shelter. The dogs had access to adequate food and water. A further follow-up inspection was scheduled.
29. On 17 February 2026, at approximately 15h00, I attended at the property. No person was present.
30. From the gate, I observed three dogs with no visible new injuries. The dogs appeared to be recovering from previous skin conditions. Food and water were present. The front area was clean; however, I was unable to observe the shelter.
31. The matter was thereafter handed over to Inspector Jonathan Siviwe Noko for further investigation and action.

I, Jeffrey Mfini, further state under oath and in English that:

32. Using my cellular phone, a Samsung S24 FE, I took photographs of my observations.

Affidavit – Veterinary Report

I, **Dr. Bronwyn Thomen**, hereby make oath and declare in English as follows:

1.

I am an adult female veterinarian registered with the South African Veterinary Council (SAVC) under registration number D09/7588. I hold a Bachelor of Veterinary Science degree (BVSc), with 15 years of experience. I am currently employed by the Cape of Good Hope SPCA. I am competent to provide veterinary services and experienced in identifying clinical signs of neglect and cruelty in animals.

2.

The facts contained in this affidavit fall within my personal knowledge unless indicated otherwise or unless it appears so from the context. The facts are also, to the best of my knowledge and belief, both true and correct.

3.

On 24 March 2026, a Pitbull-type dog was admitted into the care of the Cape of Good Hope SPCA. The animal was seized from a property situated at 125 Montclair Drive, Mandalay, under SPCA case number INSP226159. The animal was seized by Inspector Siviwe Noko.

3.1. ANIMAL INFORMATION:

The details of the animal are as follows:

- **Admission Number:** A98510
- **Species:** *Canis lupus familiaris* (Domestic dog)
- **Breed:** Pitbull-type
- **Sex and Reproductive Status:** Female, intact
- **Estimated Age:** Juvenile
- **Colour and Markings:** Black and White
- **Name:** Trixie

3.2. CLINICAL EXAMINATION FINDINGS:

On 26 February 2026, I conducted a full clinical examination of the animal in question. The following findings were recorded:

- **Body Condition Score:** 5/9 (acceptable)
- **Weight:** 17.84 kg
- **Behaviour:** Timid but friendly
- **External Parasites:** Flea infestation present
- **Dentition and Nails:** Within normal limits
- **Eyes:** No abnormalities detected
- **Other Clinical Findings:**
 - Wounds present on the nasal bridge, accompanied by swelling
 - Slight depression noted over the left frontal sinus region

I, **Dr. Bronwyn Thomen**, hereby further make oath and declare in English as follows:

4.

VETERINARY OPINION:

Upon clinical examination and radiographic assessment, it was confirmed that the animal sustained a fracture of the left medial aspect of the frontal sinus.

The cause of the injury is consistent with blunt force trauma, most likely sustained during a dog fight, as supported by the presence of overlying bite wounds to the facial region.

The duration of suffering is assessed as per-acute. Notwithstanding the acute nature of the injury, such trauma would have resulted in significant pain, distress, and discomfort at the time of infliction.

5.

PROGNOSIS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The prognosis for this animal is good, provided appropriate veterinary care is maintained.

The following treatment and management plan has been initiated and/or is recommended:

- Administration of antibiotics to prevent secondary infection
- Anti-inflammatory medication for pain and swelling management
- Deworming
- Tick and flea control
- Sterilisation

Subject to recovery and behavioural assessment, the animal may be considered suitable for rehoming.

CONCLUSION

The injuries sustained by this animal are consistent with bite wounds and associated trauma, most likely resulting from a dog fight. Although healing has commenced, the injuries would have caused significant pain and suffering.

In my professional opinion, exposure to such circumstances places the animal at risk of further harm and suffering. Accordingly, the animal should not be returned to the owner unless adequate measures are implemented to prevent recurrence of such incidents, including ensuring the animal is not exposed to aggressive interactions or environments conducive to dog fighting.

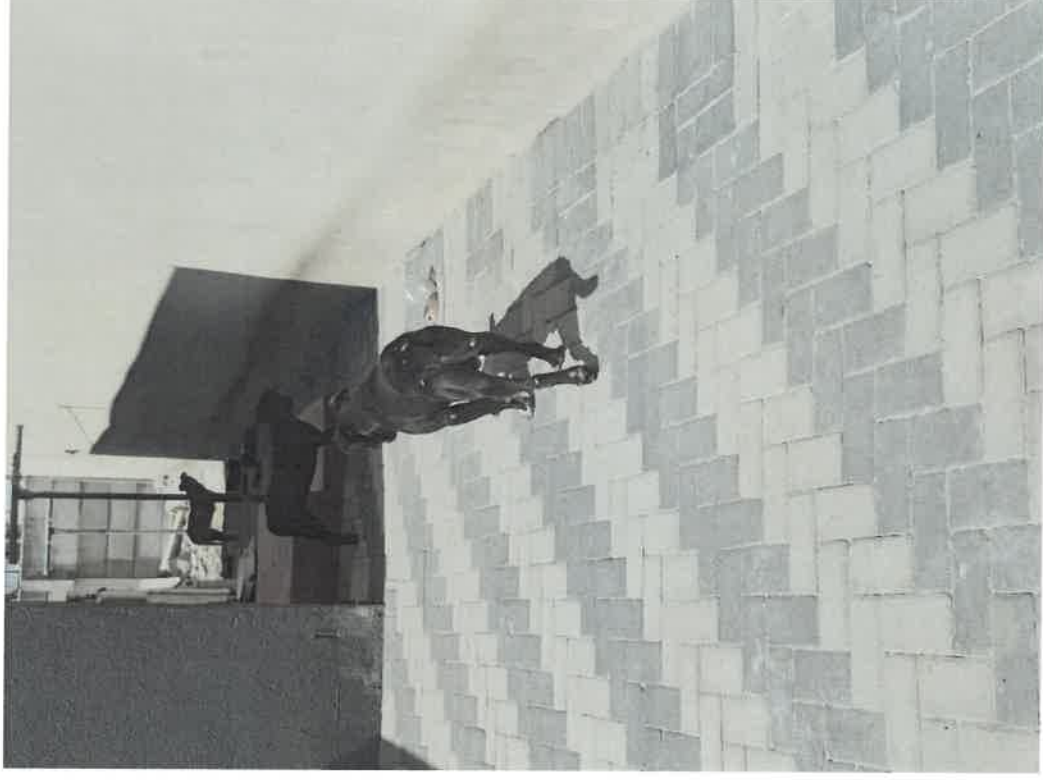


Photo 2 - Rear of black dog with visible healing wounds

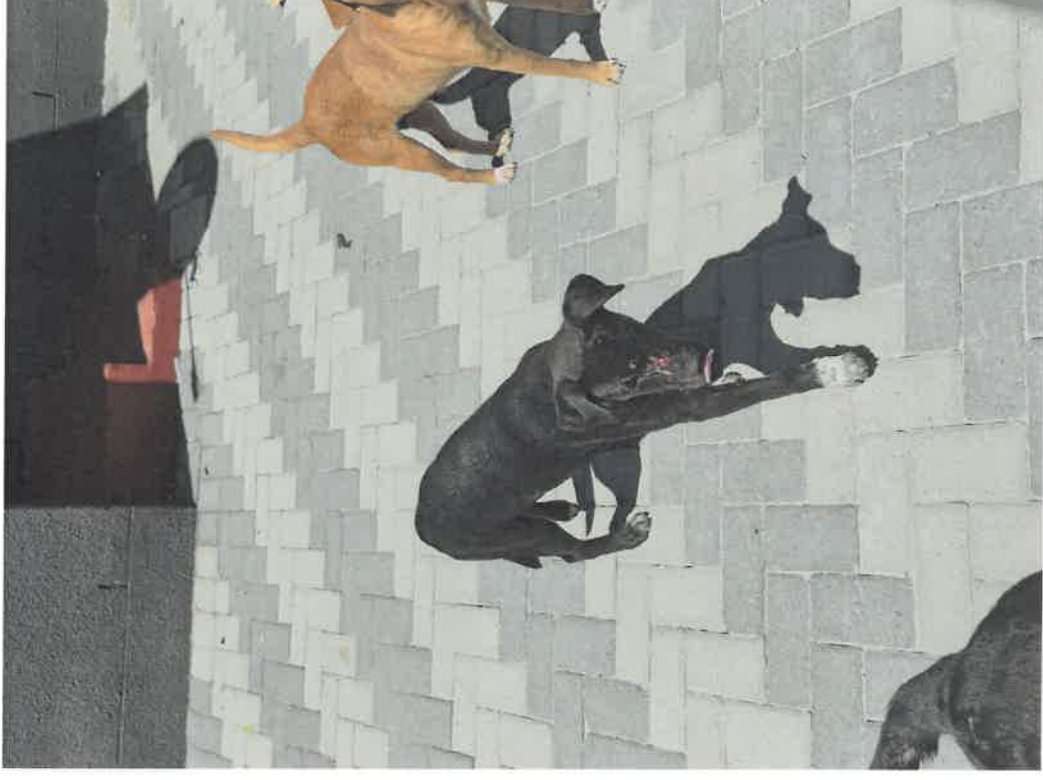


Photo 5 - Black and white dog & tan and white dog in the yard

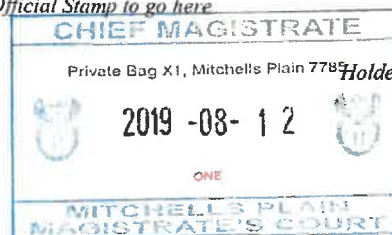

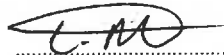

SPCA APPLICATION IN TERMS OF SECTION 3 OF ACT NO 71 OF 1962

The Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals hereby requests, upon conviction of the accused, that the following be awarded -

Denial of ownership in terms of **Section 3(1)(c) of Act 71 of 1962** (Animals Protection Act):

3. Powers of court - (1) Whenever a person is convicted of an offence in terms of this Act in respect of any animal, the court convicting him may in addition to any punishment imposed upon him in respect of that offence -

- (a) order such animal to be destroyed if in the opinion of the court it would be cruel to keep such animal alive;
- (b) order that the person convicted be deprived of the ownership of such an animal;
- (c) declare the person convicted to be unfit to own or be in charge of any animal, or of any animal of a specified kind, for a specified period;**
- (d) make any order with regard to such animal as it deems fit to give effect to any order or declaration made under any of the preceding paragraphs.

(2) Any person who is found in possession or in charge of any animal in contravention of a declaration made in terms of paragraph (c) of sub-section (1), shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to the penalties prescribed in subsection (1) of section two.

We hope that the above would be considered in the benefit of these animals, as well as other animals, to prevent any possible future suffering being caused.

CHARGES IN TERMS OF THE ANIMALS PROTECTION ACT NO 71 OF 1962

In the case of the State versus:

- **THANDO MLUNGWANA** (ACC 1).

The Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) request that the accused be charged for animal cruelty in terms of the following Sections of the **Animals Protection Act No 71 of 1962**:

SECTION 2

Offences in respect of animals - (1) Any person who:

(a) overloads, overdrives, overrides, ill-treats, neglects, infuriates, tortures or maims or cruelly beats, kicks, goads or terrifies **any animal**;

- *The accused neglected their dogs by failing to fulfil their most basic duties of care as the owners of their dogs. One of the most basic care requirements is providing adequate veterinary and anti-parasitic treatment to a pet.*

(e) being the owner of any animal, deliberately or negligently keeps such animal in a dirty or parasitic condition or allows it to become infected with external parasites or fails to render or procure veterinary or other medical treatment or attention which he is able to render or procure for any such animal in need of such treatment or attention, whether through disease, injury, delivery of young or any other cause, or fails to destroy or cause to be destroyed any such animal which is so seriously injured or diseased or in such a physical condition that to prolong its life would be cruel and would cause such animal unnecessary suffering; or

- *The accused failed to render/procure adequate veterinary treatment to the animals in his care who had an apparent skin conditions and wounds.*

(q) causes, procures or assists in the commission or omission of any of the aforesaid acts or, being the owner of any animal, permits the commission or omission of any such act;

(r) by wantonly or unreasonably or negligently doing or omitting to do any act or causing or procuring the commission or omission of any act, causes any unnecessary suffering to any animal;

shall, subject to the provisions of this Act and any other law, be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding twelve months or to such imprisonment without the option of a fine.

(2) For the purposes of sub-section (1) the owner of any animal shall be deemed to have permitted or procured the commission or omission of any act in relation to that animal if by the exercise of reasonable care and supervision in respect of that animal he could have prevented the commission or omission of such act.

(3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any law, a magistrate's court shall have jurisdiction to impose any penalty provided for in this section.
