STANDARD CONDITIONS

1. The holder of this permit shall return it to the Chief Executive Officer: Western Cape Nature Conservation Board, Private Bag X29, Gatesville, 7766, within 14 days of the date of expiry thereof.
2. In addition to the abovementioned condition, the holder of this permit must apply for the renewal of this permit (should they wish to renew it) AT LEAST three months prior to the expiry date of this permit. The onus is upon the holder of this permit to apply timeously for renewal.
3. Duties of Owners and Managers regarding Health of Animals especially relating to Foot and Mouth Disease are subject to the following condition:
 - 3.1 Any owner or manager of land on which there are animals, and any owner in respect of animals, shall whenever such animals have become or can reasonably be suspected of having become infected with any controlled animal disease, immediately report such incidence in the prescribed manner to the Director: Animal Health: Department of Agriculture.

TAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. This permit is valid for the period specified therein and must be returned within fourteen days of the date of expiry thereof to this office.
2. This permit does not authorise you to buy, sell, donate, receive as a donation and/or transport any protected wild animal. Permits for the fore-mentioned must be obtained from this office beforehand and applications must be addressed to this office, stating the number and species (scientific and common names should be mentioned) of the animals you wish to acquire, as well as the name and address of the person from whom you wish to obtain the animals.
3. Regulation 36 of the Nature Conservation Regulations, promulgated by Provincial Notice 955 dated 29 August 1975, provides that any person who keeps wild animals, except birds which are not endangered or protected wild animals, in captivity, shall keep a register in respect of such animals in which he shall -
 - 3.1. make a dated record in relation to -
 - 3.1.1 the name of each species, and
 - 3.1.2 the number of each sex of every species, or, if it is impossible to distinguish the sex, the total number of each species, which is so held, and
 - 3.1.3 as soon as any change occurs in respect of the species or number of each sex of every species or, if it is impossible to distinguish the sex, the total number of every species, keep a dated record in respect of -
 - 3.1.4 the name of the species in respect of which such change has occurred;
 - 3.1.5 the number of each sex of every species or, if it is impossible to distinguish the sex, the total number of every species in respect of which such change has occurred;
 - 3.1.6 the cause of the change, and
 - 3.1.7 if such change has occurred in consequence of the purchase, sale, donation or receipt as a donation of wild animals, the name and address of every person who is party to such purchase, sale, donation or receipt.
4. Every record contemplated in paragraph 3.1 shall be retained for as long as the wild animal, in respect of which such record has been made, is kept in captivity and, at the termination of such captivity, for the period of two years immediately succeeding such termination.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

This captivity permit is subject to the following special conditions:

1. This permit remains valid only if the circumstances under which the permit was issued, stays the same (e.g. the number of species, the address where the specimens are kept, the owner of the specimens etc.) and that the specimens / species listed on the permit remain the (permanent) personal belonging of the permit holder and is / are not used for primarily commercial purpose (i.e. sale or breeding etc.).
2. The permit holder must keep a captivity register in terms of regulation 36 of proclamation 955 of 1975. (This register must contain details of any additional animals received, any animals that are no longer in his/her possession e.g. died, sold, donated etc. and the transport permit numbers of any animals leaving his/her premises, if applicable).
3. That a nature conservation officer may inspect the permit holder's register at any reasonable time without previous notice .
4. The permit holder must obtain a permit prior to the sale, purchase, donation or receipt of donation of any wild animals.
5. The permit holder must obtain all relevant permits prior to the import, transport and export of wild animals between provinces as well as to and from foreign countries (CITES).
6. The permit holder will keep any wild animal only in an enclosure / cage that meet the legal requirements as stipulated in Regulations published in Provincial Notice 955 of 1975 which prescribes the minimum cage / enclosure sizes for wild animals (it is an offence to keep any wild animal in a cage which does not meet the minimum prescribed size).
7. No permit issued by CapeNature exempts the permit holder from complying with the National Environmental Management: Biodiversity Act (10/2004): Alien and Invasive Species Regulations.
8. The permit holder must comply with cage specifications prior to the renewal of the next captivity/S80 exemption. Failure to comply may result in the permit not being approved.
