AFFIDAVIT

I, the undersigned

**LWAZI NTUNGELE
(ID 9902055326084)**

Do hereby make oath in English and state that:

1. I am an adult male Inspector employed as such by the Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals ("SPCA") at corner of 1st Avenue and First Road, Grassy Park with contact telephone number/s 021 700 4158/9 or 083 326 2377 and with email address insp7@spca-ct.co.za.
2. The facts contained herein fall within my personal knowledge, unless the contrary appears from the context or is expressly indicated otherwise, and are, to the best of my knowledge and belief, both true and correct.
3. Where necessary, I have relied on my own observations and on information obtained during the course of my investigation, which I reasonably believe to be true and correct. Insofar as I rely on information provided by third parties, I shall endeavour to procure confirmatory affidavits from such persons.
4. To the extent that such confirmatory affidavits are not obtained, I respectfully request that this Honourable Court exercise its discretion in terms of section 3 of the Law of Evidence Amendment Act, 45 of 1998, to admit such evidence in the interests of justice.
5. All annexures referred to herein are incorporated into this affidavit by reference. These include photographic evidence, which has not been altered, edited, or manipulated in any manner, and which is submitted to accurately depict the conditions prevailing at the time of inspection.
6. I further state that the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals operates in terms of the Societies for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 169 of 1993 ("the SPCAs Act"), which regulates its powers and functions. The said Act empowers the SPCA, inter alia, to take cognisance of the application of laws affecting animals and to make representations to the appropriate authorities in that regard.
7. On 10 April 2026, the Cape of Good Hope SPCA received a request for assistance regarding a horse alleged to be underweight, lethargic, and weak at 161 Roosendaal Road, Delft, Cape Town.
8. On the same day, I attended to the complaint. Upon arrival at the scene, I met with Officer Damon from Law Enforcement as well as the owner of the horse, identified as Mr. Kurt Saayman, ID Number 0107315880083 (hereinafter referred to as "the owner").

I, Lwazi Ntungele, further state under oath and in English that:

9. The owner requested veterinary assistance for the horse. I explained to him that the SPCA is not an ambulance service and that it remained his responsibility as owner to ensure that the animal received prompt veterinary treatment.
10. The owner advised that he had communicated with Cart Horse Protection Association regarding the horse's condition and was awaiting a response from them.
11. I requested that the owner take me to the horse. We proceeded to 40 Gatwick Street, Delft, which he identified as his aunt's residence where the horse remained during the day, as the property is situated opposite a nearby field. I was informed that both the owner and the horse ordinarily resided at 161 Roosendaal Road, Delft.
12. Upon observing the horse, I noted that it appeared weak and was being continuously walked in circles to prevent it from lying down, as the owner stated it would struggle to stand up again if it did so.
13. I further observed that the horse appeared underweight, with visible ribs and poor body condition. The owner alleged that the horse may have been suffering from colic. Based on my observations and the behaviour displayed by the horse, the symptoms appeared consistent with possible colic.
14. Due to the apparent suffering and compromised condition of the animal, I offered humane euthanasia to prevent further unnecessary suffering. The owner refused this offer.
15. I issued Warning Notice 24625, instructing the owner to obtain veterinary attention for the horse within 15 hours, without delay, in order to prevent unnecessary suffering.
16. On 11 April 2026 and 12 April 2026 respectively, my colleagues, Inspectors Prins and Noko, attended at the property in follow-up to the matter. However, they were unable to locate either the owner or the horse.
17. On 13 April 2026, I attended at the owner's residence. Upon arrival, I called out from the gate, but there was no response from within the property.
18. A neighbour informed me that the owner's sister had left the property approximately one hour prior to my arrival.
19. I thereafter proceeded to the aunt's residence in Gatwick Street to enquire about the owner and the horse. I met with the aunt, who stated that the owner had not visited her over the weekend and that she had last seen the horse on Friday.
20. I inspected the stable situated opposite the property and found that the horse was no longer present.
21. The owner had been afforded sufficient opportunity to comply with the warning notice and obtain veterinary treatment for the horse. Despite this, he failed to provide any update or proof that veterinary attention had been sought.
22. The horse could not be located despite repeated follow-up visits. Based on the circumstances, I reasonably believe that the owner may be deliberately concealing the animal to avoid inspection and accountability.

I, Lwazi Ntungele, further state under oath and in English that:

23. The owner's failure to obtain veterinary treatment, refusal of humane euthanasia despite the horse's compromised condition, and subsequent concealment of the animal constitute conduct that may amount to unnecessary suffering and obstruction of lawful inspection.
24. Using my cellphone, a Samsung Glaxy A56, I took photos of what I had observed. The photos taken 10 April 2026 was placed in Photo Album A and B. The photos were not edited, altered or enhanced in any manner
25. I therefore request that the owner, Mr. Kurt Saayman, be charged with contravening the provisions of the Animals Protection Act 71 of 1962, specifically:
 - a. Section 2(1)(a) for neglecting the medical needs of the horse

(a) overloads, overdrives, overrides, ill-treats, neglects, infuriates, tortures or maims or cruelly beats, kicks, goads or terrifies any animal, or causes or procures or, being the owner, permits any of these things to be done;
 - b. Section 2(1)(e) for being the owner and failing to procure veterinary treatment

(e) being the owner of any animal, deliberately or negligently keeps such animal in a dirty or parasitic condition or allows it to become infested with external parasites or fails to render or procure veterinary or other medical treatment or attention which he is able to render or procure for any such animal in need of such treatment or attention, whether through disease, delivery of young or any other cause, or fails to destroy or cause to be destroyed any such animal which is so seriously injured or diseased or in such a physical condition that to prolong its life would be cruel and would cause such animal unnecessary suffering;
 - c. Section 2(1)(q) and (r)

(q) causes, procures or assists in the commission or omission of any act of cruelty, or any act or omission which causes unnecessary suffering to any animal;

and

(r) by wantonly or unreasonably doing or omitting to do any act, or causing or procuring the commission or omission of any act, causes any unnecessary suffering to any animal;
 - d. Section 8(4) for concealing the animal from an officer of a society

(4) Any person who wilfully obstructs, hinders or resists an officer authorized under sub-section (1) in the exercise of the power conferred upon him or conceals any animal or thing with an intent to defeat the exercise of such powers, or who upon demand fails to give his name and address to such officer, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to the penalties set out in sub-section (1) of section two.

I, Lwazi Ntungele, further state under oath and in English that:

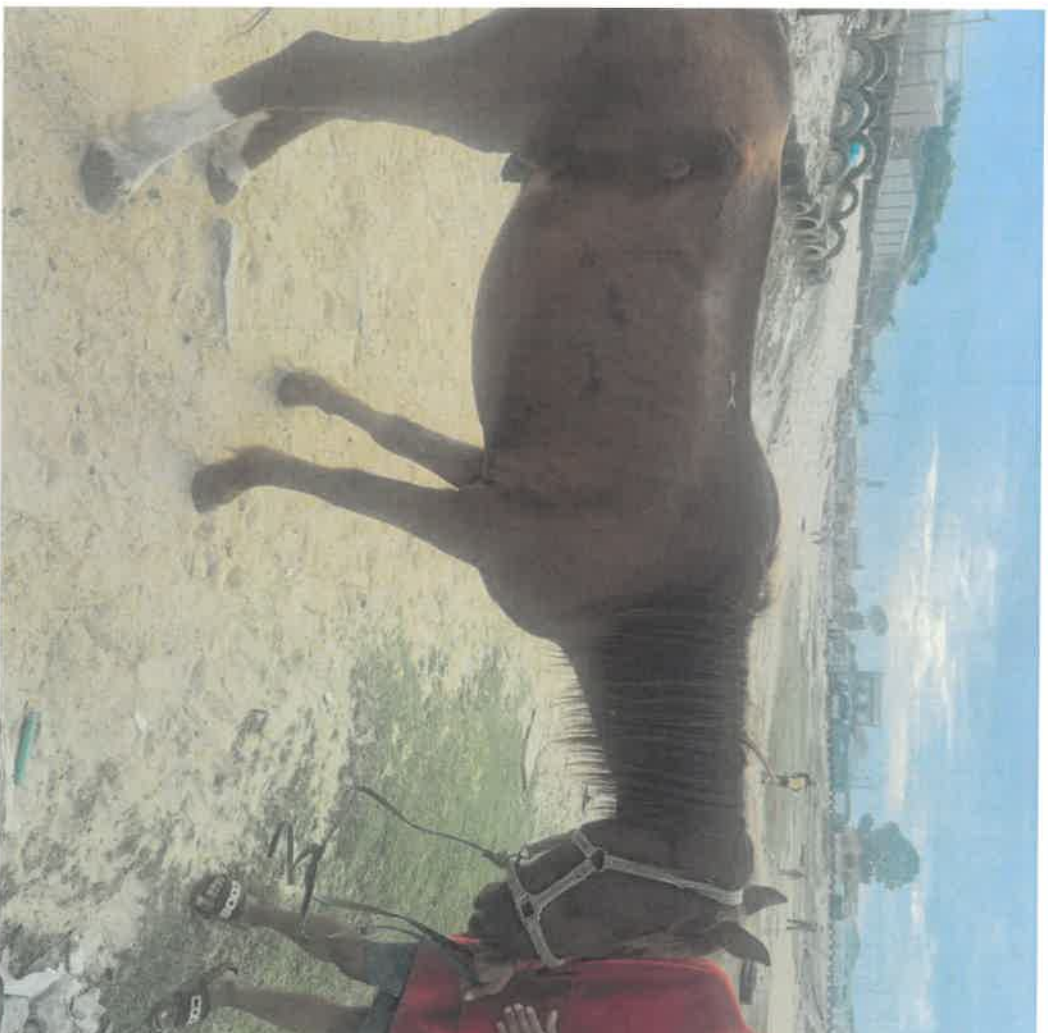


Photo 2 - Side profile of the horse with visible ribs

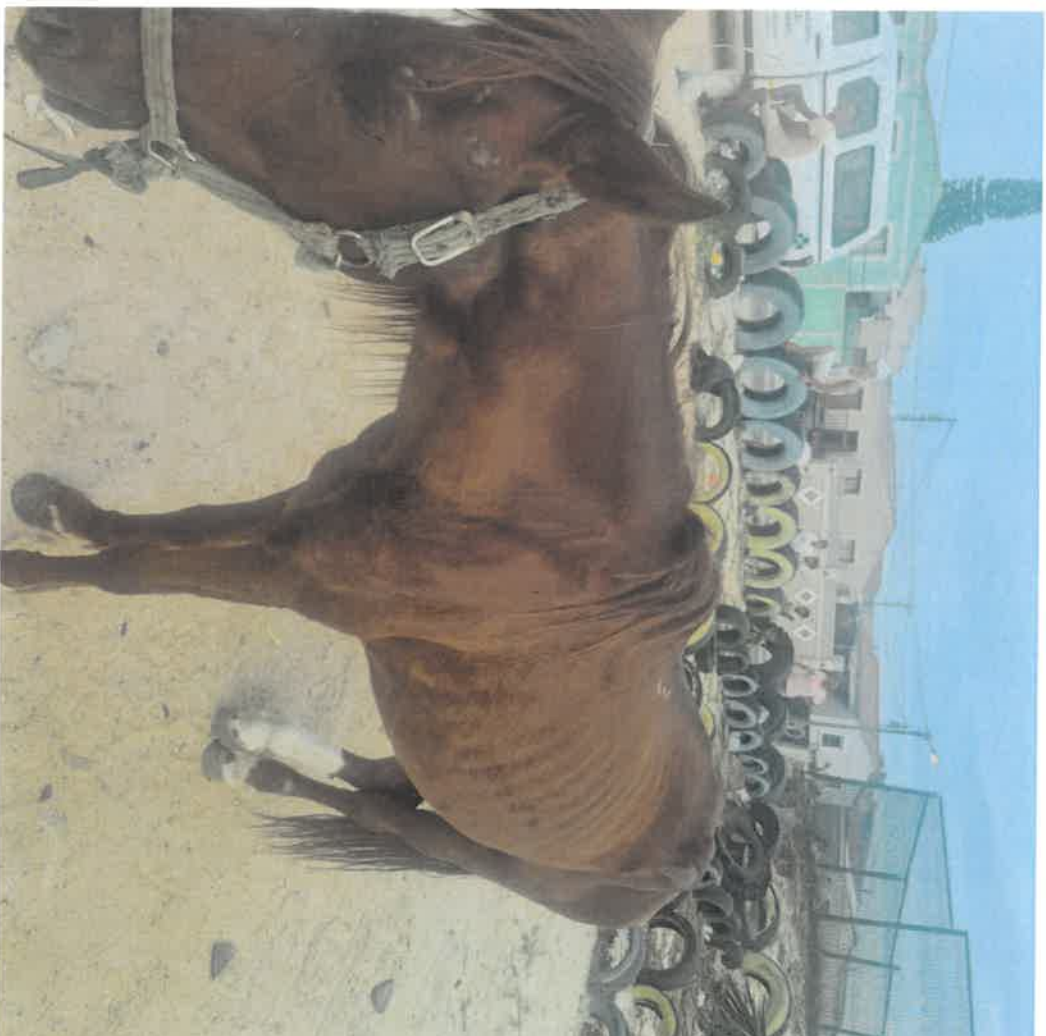


Photo 5 - The horse in question

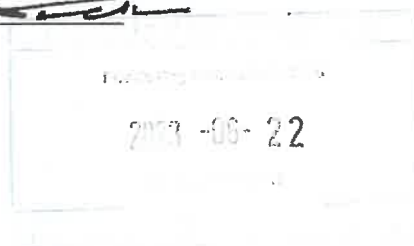

To whom it may concern,

SPCA APPLICATION IN TERMS OF SECTION 3 OF ACT NO 71 OF 1962

The Cape of Good Hope Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals hereby requests, upon conviction of the accused, that the following be awarded -

Denial of ownership in terms of **Section 3(1)(c) of Act 71 of 1962** (Animals Protection Act):

3. Powers of court - (1) Whenever a person is convicted of an offence in terms of this Act in respect of any animal, the court convicting him may in addition to any punishment imposed upon him in respect of that offence –

- (a) order such animal to be destroyed if in the opinion of the court it would be cruel to keep such animal alive;
- (b) order that the person convicted be deprived of the ownership of such an animal;
- (c) declare the person convicted to be unfit to own or be in charge of any animal, or of any animal of a specified kind, for a specified period;**
- (d) make any order with regard to such animal as it deems fit to give effect to any order or declaration made under any of the preceding paragraphs.

(2) Any person who is found in possession or in charge of any animal in contravention of a declaration made in terms of paragraph (c) of sub-section (1), shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to the penalties prescribed in subsection (1) of section two.

We hope that the above would be considered in the benefit of these animals, as well as other animals, to prevent any possible future suffering being caused.
