This letter serves to provide clinical details regarding the treatment of the following animal under my care:

Species: Cape Fur Seal

Weight: 12.4 kg

Tag No: No tag

Rescue location: Muizenberg Beach

Date of collection: 29th December 2026

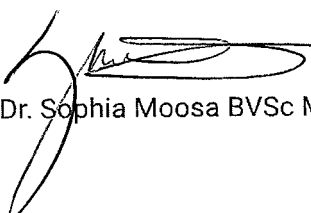
On April 12, 2024, I was contacted by HBSR and advised that the animal had vomited several times after eating, though no other clinical signs were present. After assessing the animal's mucous membranes via photograph and being unable to perform a physical examination at that time, I prescribed emergency symptomatic treatment.

Under my instruction, my nurse dispensed appropriate dosages of Buscopan (hyoscine-n-butylbromide) and Cerenia (maropitant). These were collected from the clinic and administered via subcutaneous injection by Amos and Abel. I have personally trained both individuals in this procedure and am confident in their competence. I also instructed them to check the animal's blood glucose, which was found to be within normal limits.

On the following day, it was reported that the seal's condition had improved significantly. Consequently, a site visit was not conducted.
