Suitability of Doors

Look for signs of behaviour problems in horses where stables have been chewed on doors or floors kicked

Maintenance of Stables

Well maintained no harmful features

Are doors wide enough not to touch horses hips on entry/exit High enough not to touch the ears and head

Is there suitable artificial lighting?

Fluorescent lighting when neededSpotlight when needed

Is the flooring suitable?

Flooring should be non-slip Flooring should not have holes (caused by pawing of horses)

Is the drainage suitable?

NO but cleaned & aired regularly

Urine or water doesn't pool in an area or if so this is swept out daily

Is the ventilation suitable?

Is the drainage suitable? Dried out No area is excessively muddy although there may be some muddy patches around water points

Are concentrates/mixes stored in clean sealed containers? YES Minimises pest problems and keep food fresher

Are feed drums labelled? YES Recommended to avoid errors in feeding

Is there a feed board? YES Especially where there are many horses feed to a record what horses should be fed when and what

Is medication stored separately from feed area? YES Preferable to avoid contamination

Describe pest control? CATS & HUMANE TRAPPING
