→ Must get grass bales, pellets and deworm calves and emaciated cow within 24hrs and provide us with pictures of bales pellets and dewormers

→ weigh the emaciated cow and provide us with weight

Dear NSPCA Team,

I am writing to urgently report a situation of severe animal neglect and possible cruelty that requires immediate attention.

At the location in question, there are approximately five cows and one calf, along with a number of sheep, being kept in extremely poor and inhumane conditions. The animals are confined in very small pens, standing in mud and exposed to ongoing rain. They appear to have no shelter or cover whatsoever.

The condition of the animals is deeply concerning. The cows, in particular, are visibly emaciated—reduced to skin and bones—and appear to have no access to adequate food. Their overall state suggests prolonged neglect.

It also appears that these animals may be intended for sale, which raises further concern given their current condition and welfare.

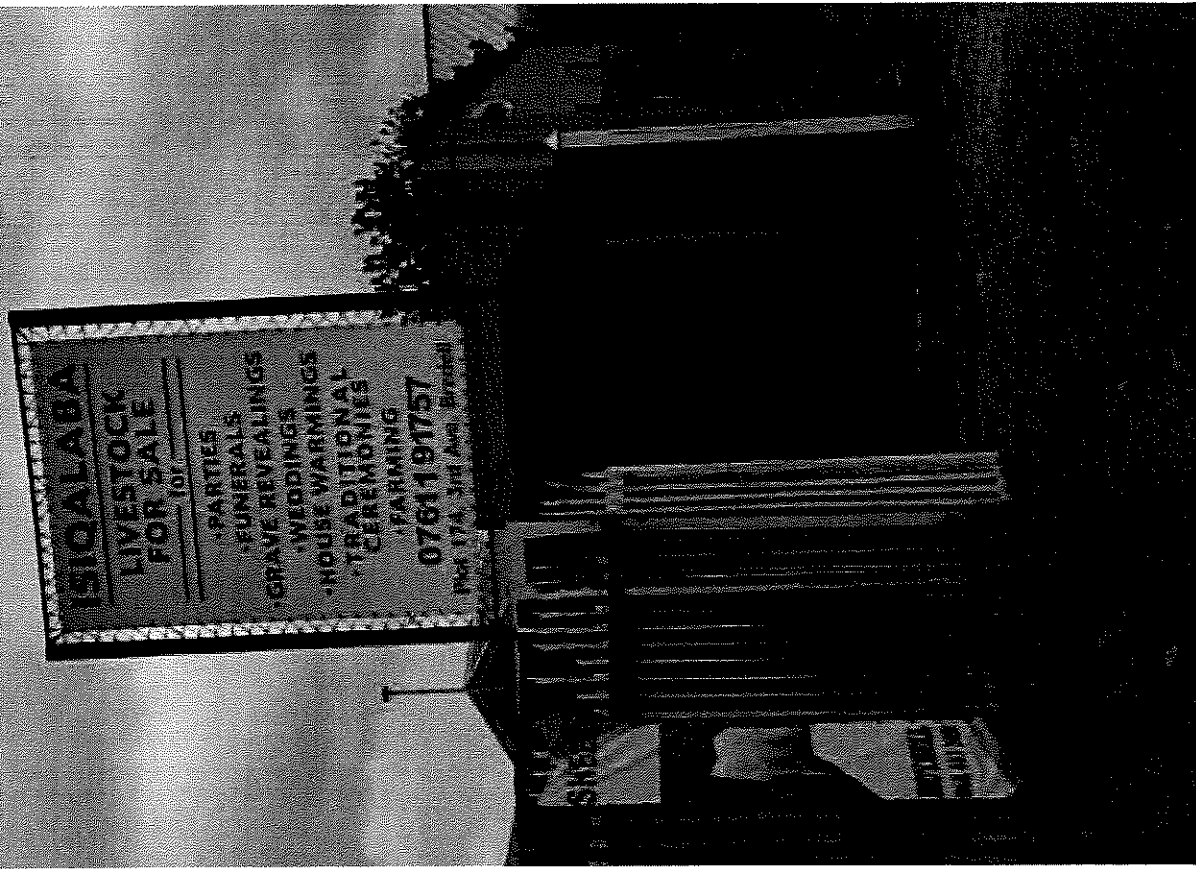
I have taken photo and video evidence of the situation and will be sending this via WhatsApp from a separate number for your review.

I respectfully urge the NSPCA to investigate this matter as a priority to prevent further suffering and to ensure the animals receive the care they urgently need.

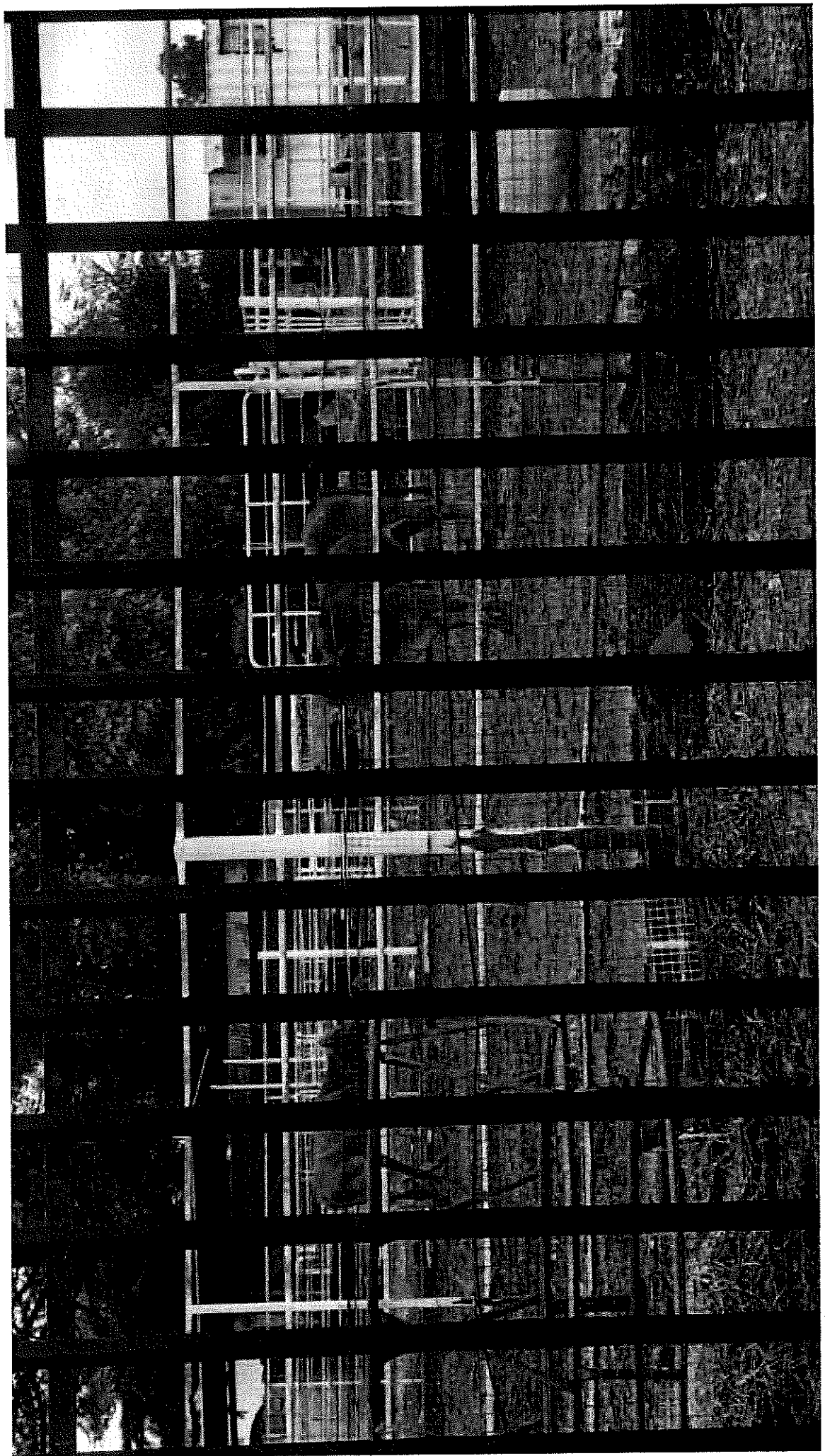
